First Phase is Complete!

On Friday, September 19, reconstruction of Artesia Blvd between Hawthorne Blvd and Prairie Ave was completed. Motorists now drive on a smooth pavement surface with new lane striping. The roadway is open to traffic and on-street parking in this section of Artesia Blvd is now permitted. It is anticipated that the median and parkway landscaping project will begin in the spring of 2004.

OCTOBER TRAFFIC INFORMATION

Traffic is reduced to one lane in each direction between Prairie Ave and Yukon Ave. **“NO-PARKING ANYTIME”** signs are posted to prohibit parking on a 24-hour basis for approximately 9 weeks. Vehicles parked illegally will be towed away.



During construction, the westbound left-turn lane from Artesia Blvd onto Prairie Ave is closed. The eastbound left-turn lane from Artesia Blvd onto Yukon Ave is also closed. Please use an alternate route.

On weekdays, traffic may be reduced to one lane between Yukon Ave and Western Ave from 7:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.

Construction Started Between Prairie Ave and Yukon Ave

On Monday, September 22, construction began on Artesia Blvd between Prairie Ave and Yukon Ave. During the next four weeks, work activities will occur within the travel lanes adjacent to the median and also inside the median area. Once completed, construction will begin on the outside travel lanes and parking lanes, including two new right-turn lanes near Prairie Ave. Caltrans may require night work near the I-405 on/off ramps. A separate Notice will be mailed to residents in the affected area listing dates and times for the night work.
