MINUTES OF AN ADJOURNED REGULAR
MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL
OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE.

An adjourned regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Torrance was held in the Council Chambers at Torrance, California, June 24, 1932, and was called to order at 7:30 P.M. by Mayor Klusman.

The following Councilmen were present: COUNCILMEN: Conner, Ludlow, Steiner, Wright and Klusman.

A motion was duly made by Councilman Steiner that beginning the first of July we carry on city business on a Cash Receipt and Disbursement basis. After some discussion Councilman Steiner withdrew the motion, in order that Councilman Ludlow might look into the matter more thoroughly.

Councilman Steiner made a motion that \$940.00 be transferred from the Alley Repair Fund to the Street Repair fund, seconded by Councilman Ludlow and carried unanimously.

Councilman Steiner read a letter received by himself from the Pacific Electric Railway Company regarding crossings. The letter stated that the Pacific Electric Railway Company would cooperate with the city in obtaining extension of time from the Railroad Commission.

Councilman Steiner suggested that after this meeting was adjourned we adjourn until next Monday afternoon at 4:30 P.M. to consider the motion on the Receipt and Disbursement basis for the city.

At this time the Council began a discussion of the Budget for the coming year. No action was taken.

Councilman Steiner moved to adjourn to Monday, June 27, 1932, at 4:30 P.M. Councilman Wright seconded the motion, which was carried unanimously.

The meeting adjourned at 11:30 P.M.
