MINUTES OF A SPECIAL MEETING
OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF TORRANCE.

A Special Meeting of the City Council of the City of Torrance, was held in the Council Chambers at Torrance, California, July 26th., 1932, and was called to order at 4:00 P.M. by Mayor Klusman.

The following Councilmen were present: COUNCILMEN: Conner, Ludlow, Wright and Klusman. ABSENT: COUNCILMAN: Steiner.

Mayor Klusman stated this being a specially called meeting the regular order of business is hereby dispensed with. Mayor Klusman stated that the meeting had been called for the purpose of considering the adoption of a resolution concerning the passing of Councilman Steiner.

The Clerk read the following Resolution:

WHEREAS, the men constituting the Council of the City of Torrance have overlooked for inspiration and guidance to G.A.R. Steiner, a member of said City Council, and have ever been conscious of the fact that his interest in Civic affairs has been exemplified in the life and conduct of Mr. Steiner; and

WHEREAS, in his death, the City Council has suffered an irreparable loss and every member thereof sorrowfully regrets that his passing at this time was a part of the divine order of things.

NOW THEREFORE, we, the City Council of the City of Torrance, in special meeting assembled this 26th., day of July, 1932, do hereby express our profound grief occasioned by his death and our heartfelt sympathy for those dear members of his family who must remain and be without his gentle guidance and sympathetic encouragement; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution be spread upon the minutes of this meeting and that a copy thereof be forwarded to Mrs. Martha M. Steiner.

Councilman Ludlow moved that the bid of Schultz & Peckham presented to this Council July 19, 1932, for One Model B B Ford (4) Cylinder, 1½ Ton Truck, 131½" Wheelbase, with Closed All Steel Cab, also equipped with Dual Drive Wheels, Overload Springs, and Front Bumper at a total purchase price of Seven Hundred Forty nine and 92/100---Dollars (\$ 749.92) be accepted.

Councilman Conner seconded the motion, which was duly carried by the following roll call vote:
