MINUTES OF AN ADJOURNED MEETING  
OF AN ADJOURNED REGULAR MEETING  
OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE  
CITY OF TORRANCE

The City Council of the City of Torrance convened in an Adjourned Meeting of an Adjourned Regular Meeting in the City Hall, Torrance, California, on Monday, July 1st., 1935.

Meeting was called to order by City Clerk Bartlett at 4:30 P.M. A recess was declared to await the arrival of Mayor Ludlow. Mayor Ludlow came in at 4:40 P.M.

City Clerk Bartlett called the roll. Those answering present were Councilmen: Hitchcock, Klusman, Stanger, Tolson and Ludlow. Absent: Councilmen: None.

A communication from the Automobile Club of Southern California requesting permission to display street safety banners on the streets was read. Councilman Klusman moved the request be granted. Councilman Tolson seconded the motion, which was carried unanimously.

A communication from Torrance Chamber of Commerce relative to a day for an annual celebration was read. Councilman Tolson to be present at the meeting.

A bulletin from the League of Municipalities was read.

A majority of the Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors was present in the audience and considerable discussion with reference to the budget for the Chamber of Commerce for the present fiscal year took place. Councilman Stanger moved the Chamber of Commerce be allotted \$8500.00 for the coming fiscal year under conditions as set forth and Attorney Rippy to draw up the contract. Councilman Hitchcock seconded the motion, the record of vote is as follows: AYES: COUNCILMEN: Hitchcock, Stanger, Tolson and Ludlow. NOES: COUNCILMAN: Klusman. ABSENT: COUNCILMEN: None.

Attorney Rippy reported he had talked with Dwight W. Stephenson, Legal Adviser, Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works, and Mr. Stephenson had advised that it would be necessary to submit applications for the projects with the San Francisco office for approval before starting election proceedings.

Engineer Leonard reported that the deed from the Kettler estate was ready but the tenant would have to be reimbursed for damage to his crop which was estimated at \$400.00.

Councilman Stanger left at 5:45 P.M.

Councilman Hitchcock moved the city reimburse the tenant on the Kettler property for all loss or damage to his crop on account of deeding the right of way for extension of Eshelman Avenue. Councilman Tolson seconded the motion, the record of vote is as follows: AYES: COUNCILMEN: Hitchcock, Klusman, Tolson and Ludlow. NOES: COUNCILMEN: None. ABSENT: COUNCILMAN: Stanger.

Councilman Tolson moved the City of Torrance reimburse the Chanslor-Canfield Midway Oil Company for all expense incurred by it as the result of the deeding of the right of way for the extension of Eshelman Avenue to the City of Torrance by the Kettler heirs. Councilman Hitchcock seconded the motion, the record of vote is as follows: AYES: COUNCILMEN: Hitchcock, Klusman, Tolson and Ludlow. NOES: COUNCILMEN: None. ABSENT: COUNCILMAN: Stanger.

Attorney Rippy presented and read in full

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF  
TORRANCE AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF CONTRACT  
WITH THE WESTINGHOUSE LAMP COMPANY.

City Clerk Bartlett reported he had not yet received any estimate from the General Petroleum Corporation.

Councilman Hitchcock moved the City Attorney be authorized to draw two contracts, for the Torrance Municipal Band and the Torrance Symphonic Orchestra and present them for approval at next Council Meeting. Councilman Tolson seconded the motion, which was carried unanimously.

Councilman Tolson moved that the meeting be adjourned. Mayor Ludlow seconded the motion, which was carried unanimously.

Mayor Ludlow declared the meeting adjourned at 6:00 P.M.
