MINUTES OF AN ADJOURNED MEETING OF
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REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL
OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE

The City Council of the City of Torrance convened in an adjourned meeting of an adjourned meeting of an adjourned regular meeting in the Council Chambers, City Hall, Torrance, California, Tuesday evening, April 7, 1936 at 7:45 P.M.

Mayor Ludlow called the meeting to order.

Clerk Bartlett called the roll, those answering present being
Councilmen: Hitchcock, Klusman, Stanger, Tolson and Ludlow. Absent:

COMMUNICATIONS

Communication from the Shell Oil Company, inclosing check for \$172.44, covering 2% of gross annual receipts. Filed.

Communication from Chet Rogers, applying for permit to operate used car lot at 1408-1412 Cabrillo Avenue.

Councilman Klusman moved that the permit be granted. Councilman Tolson seconded the motion, which was carried unanimously.

Communication from Torrance Chamber of Commerce, referring to expenditure of \$300.00 for advertisement in the Los Angeles Times regarding house building program, and asking an advance of this amount.

Councilman Stanger moved that this request be granted. Councilman Hitchcock seconded the motion, which was carried by the following roll call vote: AYES: COUNCILMEN: Hitchcock, Klusman, Stanger, Tolson and Ludlow. NOES: COUNCILMEN: None. ABSENT: COUNCILMEN: None.

Clerk Bartlett explained that the next regular meeting of the City Council will be held on April 15th., rather than the 14th., due to the municipal election.

Councilman Stanger moved that \$100.00 be appropriated for the purchase of one dozen stop signs. At 9:35 P.M., upon motion of Councilman Klusman, seconded by Councilman Hitchcock, the meeting adjourned.
