MINUTES OF AN ADJOURNED REGULAR
MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF
THE CITY OF TORRANCE

The City Council of the City of Torrance convened in an adjourned regular meeting in the Council Chamber, City Hall, Torrance, California on Tuesday, December 15, 1936 at 4:30 P.M.

Mayor Stanger called the meeting to order.

Clerk Bartlett called the roll, those answering present being Councilmen: Hitchcock, Powell, Tolson and Stanger. Absent: Councilman McGuire.

Councilman Hitchcock moved that the minutes of the regular meeting held December 8, 1936 be approved as written. Councilman Tolson seconded the motion, which was carried.

COMMUNICATIONS

Clerk Bartlett read a petition signed by 67 residents and taxpayers of the City of Torrance, requesting that A. J. Hopkins be employed four or five days each week on City labor.

Councilman Powell moved that the petition be filed. Councilman Tolson seconded the motion, which was carried.

Attorney Rippy presented and read in full:

Councilman Hitchcock moved that Resolution No. 1063 be adopted. Councilman Powell seconded the motion, which was carried by the following roll call vote: AYES: COUNCILMEN: Hitchcock, Powell, Tolson and Stanger. NOES: COUNCILMEN: None. ABSENT: COUNCILMAN: McGuire.

Attorney Rippy presented and read in full:

RESOLUTION NO. 1064

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE ASCERTAINING AND ESTABLISHING THE PREVAILING WAGE RATES FOR LABORERS, WORKMEN AND MECHANICS EMPLOYED IN CONNECTION WITH THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE ADMINISTRATION BUILDING, P.W.A. DOCKET NO. 1487-D.

Councilman Powell moved that Resolution No. 1064 be adopted. Councilman Tolson seconded the motion, which was carried by the following roll call vote: AYES: COUNCILMEN: Hitchcock, Powell, Tolson and Stanger. NOES: COUNCILMEN: None. ABSENT: COUNCILMAN: McGuire.

Councilman Powell moved that an appropriation be made of not to exceed \$50.00 for the Walteria Recreation Department, for repairs to the anteroom. Councilman Hitchcock seconded the motion, which was carried by the following roll call vote: AYES: COUNCILMEN: Hitchcock, Powell, Tolson and Stanger. NOES: COUNCILMEN: None. ABSENT: COUNCILMAN: McGuire.

Councilman Tolson stated that there had been complaints about the Auditorium being cold when the doors are being opened and closed during a program, and suggested that storm doors be installed.

After some discussion, Councilman Tolson moved that the City Clerk be authorized to get designs and figures on storm doors for the Auditorium, and also to have the ticket booth protected from draught. Councilman Hitchcock seconded the motion, which was carried by the following roll call vote: AYES: COUNCILMEN: Hitchcock, Powell, Tolson and Stanger. NOES: COUNCILMEN: None. ABSENT: COUNCILMAN: McGuire.

At 5 P.M., upon motion of Councilman Tolson, seconded by Councilman Powell, the meeting adjourned to Thursday, December 17, 1936 at 4:30 P.M.
