

MINUTES OF AN ADJOURNED MEETING
 OF AN ADJOURNED REGULAR MEETING
 OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES
 OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE

Torrance, California,
 October 14, 1924.

An adjourned meeting of an adjourned, regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance was held in the Council Chambers at Torrance, California, October 14, 1924, and was called to order at 7:00 P.M. by President Smith. The following Trustees were present: Deininger, Torrence and Smith. Absent: Brooks, and Fitzhugh.

The regular order of business was dispensed with.

Protests against the issuance of bonds, covering the unpaid assessments for work done on Western Avenue and El Prado, were called for.

The Clerk reported that no written protests had been filed; and no protests were voiced. The Clerk then read:

RESOLUTION NO. 197
 REGARDING THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS FOR UNPAID
 ASSESSMENTS ON WESTERN AVENUE

Trustee Deininger moved that Resolution No. 197 be adopted as read, and the same filed in the office of the City Clerk. Trustee Torrence seconded the motion which was duly carried by the following roll call vote:

AYES; Trustees: Deininger, Torrence and Smith.
 NOES; Trustees: None.
 ABSENT; Trustees: Brooks and Fitzhugh.

President Smith stated that protests against the building of sidewalks under Resolution of Intention No 196 would now be heard.

No protests had been filed nor were any voiced.
The City Engineer read:

RESOLUTION NO. 198

ORDERING THE WORK TO BE DONE ON THE
SIDEWALKS

Trustee Deininger moved that Resolution No. 198 be adopted as read, and the same filed in the office of the City Clerk. Trustee Torrence seconded the motion which was duly carried by the following roll call vote:

AYES; Trustees: Deininger, Torrence and Smith.

NOES; Trustees: None.

ABSENT; Trustees: Brooks and Fitzhugh.

Next was the hearing against the improving of Cabrillo Avenue between Plaza del Amo and Camino Real.

Two written protests had been filed with the Clerk which same were read by him. One was signed by John Henderson Griffin and the other by James W. Post, et al.

On motion by Trustee Torrence, seconded by Trustee Deininger, and a majority, the hearing was continued until November 3, 1924, at 2:00 P.M.

Ed McDonald submitted a written application for a change of zone on Lot 7, Block 17.

Trustee Torrence moved that an Ordinance be drafted rezoning Lots 7 and 8, Block 17, from Zone 2 to Zone 3. Trustee Deininger seconded the motion which was duly carried.

Attorney Briney read:

RESOLUTION NO. 199
REGARDING SANTA FE CROSSING ON CABRILLO

After same was amended, Trustee Deininger moved that Resolution No. 199 be adopted as read, and same filed in the office of the City Clerk. Trustee Torrence seconded the motion which was duly carried by the following roll call vote:

AYES; Trustees: Deininger, Torrence and Smith.

NOES; Trustees: None.

ABSENT; Trustees: Brooks, and Fitzhugh.

In the matter of Dr. Steiner's application for a change of zone in Block 57, Trustee Deininger moved that the City notify property owners that it is the intention to change the setback line in said block, and set a date for hearing on same. Trustee Torrence seconded the motion which was duly carried.

The fire escape on the Auditorium building and the recommendation put forth by Dr. Steiner as to letting same rest permanently on the parking space was to be investigated by the proper committee and reported at next meeting.

The required permission to cut down three trees on Lot 11, Block 7, was to be attended to by the Street Supt. in the usual way.

Mr. Sanchez's request for a pool Hall license to operate the Industrial Club was to be issued by the Clerk.

Trustee Deininger reported that the committee had inspected the Gilbert, Hansen & Page Auto camp and found same was being built according to the plans originally submitted; ans that the tents would be removed as soon as houses were built; that the buildings seemed to be of very good constr-

uction, each containing a kitchen sink, but to have community toilets; that the grounds and parkings were to be made attractive. a communication from the owners was to be placed on file.

Another week's time was requested on the truck question by Trustee Deininger.

Trustee Torrence introduced:

At 8:30 P.M. Trustee Torrence moved to adjourn. Trustee Deininger seconded the motion which was duly carried.
