City of Torrance Announces Grand Re-Opening of McMaster Park

Torrance, Calif., January 7, 2016 – On Tuesday, January 12 at 4 p.m. the City of Torrance will gather to mark the official re-opening of McMaster Park located at 3624 Artesia Boulevard.

Major components of the McMaster Park renovations include indoor and outdoor building upgrades, Americans with Disabilities Act and site improvements including the Herma Tillim Senior Center, the North Torrance Community Center, and the park/recreation buildings. A new park entrance off of Artesia Boulevard opens to reveal new playground equipment, a new picnic area and basketball court, the reconfiguration of the existing baseball field with a new multi-use sports field, irrigation upgrades, parking lot restriping, fencing along Artesia Boulevard, and improved security lighting and landscaping.

McMaster Park is situated on 5.5 acres and was purchased in parcels from 1949 to 1953, its prior use was a railroad right-of-way, and it was named after former Fire Chief John McMaster. Since its original acquisition, McMaster Park has grown to become a thriving park for residents of all ages in the North Torrance area.

“I am happy to say that we are pleased with the overall result of the newly renovated McMaster Park. It’s now ready to be enjoyed by present and future generations of Torrance residents,” noted John Jones, Community Service Director.

The City thanks the community for its patience, cooperation and support throughout the renovation process, and invites the public to join in the celebration of the McMaster Park dedication.
