

UPDATE Torrance Beach Remains Open

Torrance, Calif., June 2, 2015 —This is an update on the South Bay Incident that occurred in Manhattan Beach on Thursday, May 28, 2015. All Los Angeles County beaches continue to remain OPEN at this time.

There are new reports of Tar Balls at Redondo Beach, Zuma Beach and Manhattan Beach near Rosecrans Tower. Clean-up crews have responded and are conducting clean-up operations for the affected beach areas. Los Angeles County South bay beaches continue to be monitored and patrolled. Personnel are monitoring the shoreline. Clean-up crews will remain available to respond at the shoreline assessment team's direction as needed.

Any member of the public that sees anything out of the ordinary on the beaches should call the National Response Center hotline at 1-800-424-8802. The NRC is the sole federal point of contact for reporting pollution in the environment.
