



Paradise Park is situated on 4.7 acres at 5006 Lee Street. The land was acquired in 1955. The name was chosen through a park sites naming contest for local school children. However, no formal park dedication was ever done. This land was part of the Milton Kauffman Sub-division. The park is adjacent to Anza Elementary School and often used for picnics and other school activities. In 1983, a 70-foot mosaic sidewalk made by Sepulveda Elementary School students was donated to the park when Sepulveda School was closed.

The park provides recreational opportunities for West Torrance residents. Facilities include: 3 different playground sets. One set is made up of original metal frame play equipment: a submarine, a train, a planet. There is also a tot metal seat and crane, and colorful play equipment which was installed in 1996 as part of the Proposition A Grant funding. Additional features include a sheltered picnic area, two lighted tennis courts and a basketball court.
