**BUCKET**

18"Hx1'D plastic paint bucket to carry the following miscellaneous items and to serve as a seat while painting:

apron  
1/2 gal plastic bottle for water  
4 1/2"D x 3 1/2"H plastic container for ptg  
half roll of paper towels  
insect repellent  
sun-block  
hat with 36 degree wide brim  
old cloth towel to use as cushion for sitting on bucket  
plastic zip-lock bag for palette

**PORTABLE BIN FOR OTHER SUPPLIES**

8"W x 16" long x +/- 7"H plastic hinged bin to carry brushes, tubes of paint, pencil, erasers, box knife and other misc tools.

*All this equipment is necessary for outdoor/plein-air painting. You obviously don't need certain of items listed under "bucket" if you're painting indoors. And you obviously would not need to use the bucket for a seat if you're painting inside where there is a chair.*
