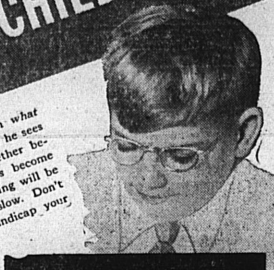

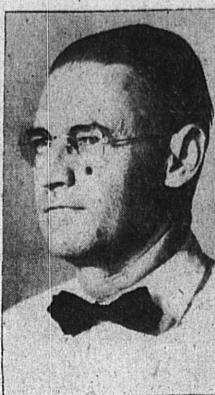
Rev. Penner Is Called for Three Years

For several years the church services were held in the parsonage located in Hammerton Tract. Two years ago a small church building was moved to the present church location at 1501 W. Carson. As a result of the present over-crowded building, plans are now under way to build in the near future a new church edifice to provide adequate room for present and future needs.

Reverend and Mrs. Penner both are active in the religious work of the city. Rev. Penner being president of the Torrance Ministerial Association and Mrs. Penner, president of the Women's Christian Temperance Union of Torrance.

The name of Kristi Palica was added Tuesday to the Narbonne High school gold star honor roll after the 29-year-old sergeant was disclosed to have been killed in action on Luzon. The tragic news was brought first to his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Ambrose Palica of 1943 W. 257th st., Lomita.

One of four brothers in the Armed Forces who have two younger brothers making fame in the baseball world, Kristi Palica was in Australia and New Guinea before being sent to the Philippines two years ago. He formerly worked at National Supply Company plant at Torrance and at California shipyard. He leaves besides his family his estranged wife, Virginia, and their daughter, Nancy Lee, aged 3.

Other sons in the family are Johnny, 27, in the Navy and also in the Philippines; Ambrose in the Army stationed near Seattle; Nick, 22, machine gunner with the armed guard on a tanker; Alex, 18, with the Seattle Rainiers and Irving, 17, under contract with the Brooklyn Dodgers while yet too young for the big league.

Johnny has a wife, a daughter Jeanette, age 4, and a six-month-old daughter he has not yet seen.

New Business Block Will Be Built Here

Another Torrance business block, reflecting the growth of the Torrance commercial area, has been authorized, it was revealed by building permits of the city which were issued during the past week.

The total reached a new high with the issuance of the permit to General Petroleum Corporation for expansion of its plant in the amount of \$3,060,000.

The business block authorized is for K. R. Ruffell, 1276-78 Sartori ave., who will construct a 30 by 60 foot store building to house his shoe repair business. It will cost approximately \$6000. Dock Aircraft Corp. took out a permit to build an \$18,000 storage tank at 2321 Abalone ave., also adding materially to the improvement of Torrance.
