1. CALL TO ORDER

The Torrance Airport Commission convened in a regular session on Thursday, April 11, 2019 at 7:00 p.m. at the West Annex Meeting Room, Torrance City Hall.

2. ROLL CALL

3. FLAG SALUTE

Commissioner Ross led the Pledge of Allegiance.

4. AFFIDAVIT OF AGENDA POSTING

<u>MOTION</u>: Commissioner De Rago, seconded by Commissioner O'Brien, moved to accept and file the report of the City Clerk on the posting of the agenda for this meeting; a roll call vote reflected unanimous approval.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF MARCH 14, 2019

<u>MOTION</u>: Commissioner Ross moved to approve the Airport Commission meeting minutes of March 14, 2019 as presented. Commissioner O'Brien seconded the motion; a roll call vote reflected unanimous approval.

6. ORAL COMMUNICATIONS #1 AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

Commissioner O'Brien provided an update on the 4th annual STEM Day at the Airport on April 26, 2019. She stated that Torrance Police Department drone Sergeants are scheduled to teach students the physics of drone flight and how they are used in Police work.

Commissioner Ross shared his experience at the Griffith Observatory.

Jim Gates distributed posters and a handout of the venue lay out for the Collings Foundation's Wings of Freedom Tour on April 25-28, 2019.

ACTION ITEMS – None.

8. <u>INFORMATION ITEMS</u>

8A. AERONAUTICAL OPERATIONAL INFORMATION UNDER THE PURVIEW OF THE GENERAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT

Facility Operations Manager Pinela reviewed the following reports in the material of record: Hangar and Tiedown Rental Status, Ongoing Projects, April Meeting Room Calendar,

Hangar Waiting List, Events Requiring Emergency Response for March 2019, and Airfield Operations Status for February 2019. He noted there are currently two hangar vacancies and 52 tiedowns available. Referring to Report 2, Ongoing Projects, he stated that staff is repackaging and soliciting new bids for the burned hangars and that staff is putting together a job specification to re-paint runway 29R/11L. He described the three incidents that occurred in March 2019 and noted that operations were approximately 500 less than in February 2018.

Chairperson Glass questioned why the Collings Foundation is scheduled to be in the Airport Meeting Room on April 25-28, and Jim Gates explained that usage is being blocked due to a parking shortage.

9. ORAL COMMUNICATIONS #2

Commissioner O'Brien, with concurrence from Commissioners, directed staff to provide a monthly report on the number of expulsions due to tenant lease violations.

Responding to an inquiry from Commissioner Gong, Facility Operations Manager Pinela described mandated annual Fire Department inspections, noting that staff conducts "spot" inspections in response to complaints.

Commissioner O'Brien stated that the 99s had two new women pilots last month, noting that from San Luis Obispo to San Diego the number of women actively participating doubled last year.

Referring to David Bentley's concerns expressed at the March 14 meeting, Jim Gates stated that the Police Department has indicated there is not enough evidence to proceed with a legal case at this time.

Ernst Schubert voiced his concerns on several issues, and Facility Operations Manager Pinela offered to speak with him after the meeting.

Jim Gates stated there are 14 people on the waiting list for the Sling Flight Academy.

ZAMPERINI FIELD HANGAR AND TIEDOWN INFORMATION

Total Number of City-Owned Hangars	341
Total Number of Hangar Vacancies	3
Total Number of Airport Tiedowns	181
Total Number of Tiedowns Available	54

The 341 hangars owned by the City are broken down into three size categories: small, medium, and executive. Of 341 total hangars, 74 were built by the City, while 267 hangars were funded by several private contractors. At time of construction, these hangars were built with individual preferences in mind and were not standardized according to size. Here are approximate sizes of small, medium and executive hangars.

Small Type A:	Under 40' Door Opening Width	800-1,200 sq. ft.
Small Type B:	40'-41' Door Opening Width	800-1,200 sq. ft.
Medium:	52'-54' Door Opening Width	1,200-2,200 sq. ft.
Executive:	57'-61' Door Opening Width	2,200-3,200 sq. ft.

Current rates for hangars are: \$0.569/sq. ft. per month for Torrance Residents. \$0.639/sq. ft. per month for Non-Residents.

Current rates for Tiedowns are: Single Engine \$113.00 Twin Engine \$125.00

Current rates for Transient (Overnight) are: Single Engine \$10.00

Twin Engine \$15.00 Jet Engine \$20.00

4/10/2019- 1600 A Sling aircraft with a stuck throttle had to shut down engine, but was able to land safely. He was towed by Operations 102 to FBO without incident. TFD was not required.

Definitions:

ACCIDENT: An occurrence associated with the operation of an aircraft which takes place between the time any person boards the aircraft with the intention of flight and all such persons have disembarked, and in which any person suffers death or serious injury, or in which the aircraft receives substantial damage.

SUBSTANTIAL DAMAGE means damage or failure which adversely affects the structural, strength, performance, or flight characteristics of the aircraft, and which would normally require major repair or replacement of the affected component. Engine failure or damage limited to an engine if only one engine fails or is damaged, bent fairings or cowling, dented skin, small punctured holes in the skin or fabric, ground damage to rotor or propeller blades, and damage to landing gear, wheels, tires, flaps, engine accessories, brakes, or wingtips are not considered "substantial damage".

SERIOUS INJURY means any injury which: (1) requires hospitalization for more than 48 hours, commencing within 7 days from the date the injury was received; (2) results in a fracture of any bone (except simple fractures of fingers, toes, or nose); (3) causes severe hemorrhages, nerve, muscle or tendon damage; (4) involves any internal organ; or (5) involves second or third degree burns; or any burns affecting more than 5% of the body surface.

INCIDENT: Any occurrence other than an accident associated with the operation of an aircraft, which affects or could affect the safety of operations.

NOTE: Per the FAA, Airport Operations totals will no longer be reported for the previous month. Due to automation, the totals will now be reported two months after they occur.
