Students must be prepared to discuss and write about the novel with special attention to its characters, themes, point of view, and tone (author's attitude towards the subject) ON THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL.

Incoming 9th Grade Honors must purchase: *Outliers: The Story of Success* by Malcolm Gladwell

Incoming 10th Grade Honors must purchase: *The Lord of the Flies* by William Golding
