



El Prado Park is the City of Torrance's first passive park, sitting on 2.88 acres, located at 1401 Cravens Ave. It was designed in 1912 by the landscape architect of "Old Downtown Torrance," Frederick Olmsted Jr. from Boston, MA. El Prado meaning, The Meadow, is a tree lined park that spans three blocks from Cravens Avenue to Manuel Avenue.

In 2012, 'Centennial Plaza' was created at the North end of the park. Over 850 local residents, businesses and organizations purchased commemorative bricks to create the plaza. A parade and time capsule dedication were held on September 16, 2012. The time capsule is planned to be opened during the bicentennial in 2112. We hope to see you there!
