MINUTES OF AN ADJOURNED REGULAR
MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF
THE CITY OF TORRANCE.

The City Council of the City of Torrance convened in an adjourned Regular Meeting in the City Hall, Torrance, California, on Tuesday, November 7th., 1933.

Meeting was called to order by Mayor Conner at 7:45 P.M.

City Clerk Bartlett called the roll. Those answering present were Councilmen: Klusman, Wright and Conner. Absent: Councilmen: Hitchcock and Ludlow.

This being an adjourned meeting, the regular order of business was suspended.

City Clerk Bartlett read a communication from the City of Burbank, California, in regard to delinquencies under Improvement Bond Act of 1915. A meeting of City Attorneys has been called for Friday, November 10th., at 12:00 o'clock, Noon, at the Alexander Hotel, Los Angeles, to discuss this important matter. Attorney Jensen stated he would attend this meeting. Councilman Klusman moved this letter be filed. Councilman Wright seconded the motion, which was carried unanimously.

A communication was read from J.L. Pomeroy, M.D. County of Los Angeles, Department of Health, stating each health center, large or small, will require a separate State permit to operate in our district. Attorney Jensen introduced and read

Councilman Klusman moved that Resolution No. 588 be adopted. Councilman Wright seconded the motion, which was carried unanimously.

City Clerk Bartlett read a communication from The Industrial Housing Corporation with reference to employees of the Columbia Steel

Company parking their cars in front of houses in Columbia Court. Councilman Wright moved that the City Clerk write a letter to Mr. Lanz of the Columbia Steel Company requesting him to take the matter up with their Company office again and see if two or three vacant lots can be obtained for parking purposes. Councilman Conner seconded the motion, which was lost for want of a majority vote, Councilman Klusman voting no.

A communication was read from the City of Gardena, Gardena, California, expressing their appreciation of the valuable assistance and cooperation from the Fire Department and Police Department at the time of their dangerous fire on the night of October 21st.

Mayor Conner asked Attorney Jensen for any report he might have on the water application. Attorney Jensen stated the application is being acted upon and we should officially hear regarding it in the near future. There has been no apparent decision. Mayor Conner asked Engineer Leonard if he had any report to make. Engineer Leonard stated Attorney Jensen covered the matter.

Mr. Parks, in the audience, stated the Merchants Association had requested him to bring before the Council the matter of turning on all the street lights in the downtown district during the month of December. This will be taken care of at the next meeting.

Mr. Nelson brought up the matter of certain flood lights at the Edison Plant at 190th. Street. After some discussion Councilman Klusman moved that the City Council instruct the City Engineer to have an overhead light put in by the Edison Company. Councilman Conner seconded the motion, the record of vote is as follows: AYES: COUNCILMEN: Klusman and Conner. NOES: COUNCILMAN: Wright. ABSENT: COUNCILMEN: Hitchcock and Ludlow. The motion was lost.

Mayor Conner asked Engineer Leonard if he had any further reports to make, anything in regard to the Park. Engineer Leonard stated we are getting along pretty well with the Park.

Councilman Wright moved that warrants be drawn and registered on all bills properly audited. Councilman Klusman seconded the motion, the record of the vote is as follows: AYES: COUNCILMEN: Klusman, Wright and Conner. NOES: COUNCILMEN: None. ABSENT: COUNCILMEN: Hitchcock and Ludlow.

Councilman Wright moved that the meeting be adjourned. Councilman Conner seconded the motion, which was carried unanimously.

Mayor Conner declared the meeting adjourned at 8:20 P.M.
