MINUTES OF AN ADJOURNED REGULAR  
MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF  
THE CITY OF TORRANCE

The City Council of the City of Torrance convened in an Adjourned Regular Meeting in the City Hall, Torrance, California, on Tuesday, July 3rd., 1934.

Meeting was called to order by Mayor Ludlow at 7:30 P.M.

City Clerk Bartlett called the roll. Those answering present were Councilmen: Hitchcock, Klusman, Tolson and Ludlow. Absent: Councilman: Stanger. Councilman Stanger arrived at 7:37 P.M.

City Clerk Bartlett called attention to a change to be made in the Chamber of Commerce contract as recommended by the City Attorney. Councilman Hitchcock moved the correction be made in the Chamber of Commerce contract as recommended. Councilman Tolson seconded the motion, which was carried, Councilman Klusman voting no.

Councilman Hitchcock moved the Clerk be instructed to notify Salisbury, Bradshaw and Taylor to proceed with Item 3-a Aid in negotiation to purchase the Water Company, under Second Assumption in accordance with their proposal to the City Council dated May 22nd., 1933. Councilman Stanger seconded the motion. Councilman Klusman stated Mr. Bradshaw had set a definite price. What is the use of him to negotiate when the Water Company would not accept their price. The record of vote is as follows: AYES: COUNCILMEN: Hitchcock, Stanger, Tolson and Ludlow. NOES: COUNCILMAN: Klusman. ABSENT: COUNCILMEN: None.

RESOLUTION NO. 633

CLEANING VACANT LOTS

Councilman Stanger moved that Resolution No. 633 be adopted. Councilman Tolson seconded the motion, the record of vote is as follows: AYES: COUNCILMEN: Hitchcock, Klusman, Stanger, Tolson and Ludlow. NOES: COUNCILMEN: None. ABSENT: COUNCILMEN: None.

Mayor Ludlow stated a picture had been taken of the three fire trucks and believed one should be taken of the Walteria Fire House. Councilman Hitchcock moved that the City pay for these pictures. Councilman Tolson seconded the motion, the record of vote is as follows: AYES: COUNCILMEN: Hitchcock, Klusman, Stanger, Tolson and Ludlow. NOES: COUNCILMEN: None. ABSENT: COUNCILMEN: None.

Mayor Ludlow read a letter with reference to cooperative gardening for the unemployed and also with reference to a woman's sewing project under the SERA. Councilman Tolson stated he had made a trip to the city in behalf of the music program and found the set-up was 24 hours a week and they would be paid \$12.00; if the City is to sponsor the band, the musicians would have to be included in our Compensation Insurance. Councilman Stanger moved any members of the band under the SERA be included in our Compensation Insurance. Councilman Hitchcock seconded the motion, the record of the vote is as follows: AYES: COUNCILMEN: Hitchcock, Klusman, Stanger, Tolson and Ludlow. NOES: COUNCILMEN: None. ABSENT: COUNCILMEN: None.

Engineer Leonard said he had talked with Mr. Comer, Manager of the Veterans Relief, in regard to this cooperative gardening plan, and found that their organization was going to be busy canning fruit and vegetables for the next five or six weeks.

Councilman Hitchcock moved that the meeting be adjourned.  
Councilman Stanger seconded the motion, which was carried unanimously.

Mayor Ludlow declared the meeting adjourned at 8:05 P.M.
