MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING  
OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF  
THE CITY OF TORRANCE

The City Council of the City of Torrance convened in a Regular Meeting in the City Hall, Torrance, California, on Tuesday, September 25th., 1934.

Meeting was called to order by Mayor Ludlow at 7:45 P.M.

City Clerk Bartlett called the roll. Those answering present were Councilmen: Hitchcock, Klusman, Stanger, Tolson and Ludlow. Absent: Councilmen: None.

Councilman Hitchcock moved the minutes of the regular meeting of September 11th., 1934, and the minutes of an adjourned regular meeting of September 18th., 1934, be approved as written. Councilman Stanger seconded the motion, which was carried unanimously.

City Clerk Bartlett read a communication from the Treasury Department, Washington, advising that it is believed that proposals for construction of the Federal Building at Torrance will be requested sometime next month.

A communication from the General Pipe Line Company of California enclosing statement as required under the provisions of Los Angeles County Franchise Ordinance No. 781, was read.

Councilman Hitchcock reported the yard shop is practically completed and extended an invitation to the Council to go down and look it over.

Attorney Rippy stated Mr. Post of the First National Bank had advised that the city cut down on registered warrants as much as possible as the amounts other banks could accept would be limited from now on.

ORDINANCE NO. 259

PLUMBING ORDINANCE

Councilman Stanger moved we dispense with the further reading of Ordinance No. 259. Councilman Hitchcock seconded the motion, which was carried unanimously. Councilman Stanger moved Ordinance No. 259 be approved for its first reading. Councilman Hitchcock seconded the motion, which was carried unanimously.

Mayor Ludlow believed it advisable to have the second reading of Ordinance No. 258.

Councilman Stanger read a report on fire hydrants that need attention in the Walteria District. Mr. Quandt of the Water Company stated that his men were working on the hydrants, and everything will be completed within a week or ten days.

AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 254 PROVIDING  
FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$200,000.00 BONDS.

Councilman Hitchcock moved that Ordinance No. 258 be adopted for final reading. Councilman Tolson seconded the motion, the record of vote is as follows: AYES: COUNCILMEN: Hitchcock, Klusman, Stanger, Tolson and Ludlow. NOES: COUNCILMEN: None. ABSENT: COUNCILMEN: None.

Councilman Stanger reported with reference to South Torrance petitions for fire phones, that he communicated with several of the surrounding communities and found they were not furnishing fire phones in any of their districts. However, he requested more time to investigate this matter.

Councilman Stanger stated the Torrance Hospital is not paying and there is danger of our losing it unless something is done to help them. Attorney Rippy was requested to investigate this matter.

Councilman Hitchcock moved that warrants be drawn for all bills properly audited. Councilman Stanger seconded the motion, the record of vote is as follows: AYES: COUNCILMEN: Hitchcock, Klusman, Stanger, Tolson and Ludlow. NOES: COUNCILMEN: None. ABSENT: COUNCILMEN: None.

Councilman Hitchcock moved that the meeting be adjourned. Councilman Tolson seconded the motion, which was carried unanimously.

Mayor Ludlow declared the meeting adjourned at 9:20 P.M.
