The City Council of the City of Torrance, convened in a Special Meeting in the Council Chamber, City Hall, Torrance, California, on Friday, April 18, 1947, at 4:30 p.m.

Mayor Sherfey called the meeting to order.

Clerk Bartlett called the roll, those answering present being Councilmen: Jackson, Powell, Tolson and Sherfey. Absent: Councilmen: Gilbert.

Clerk Bartlett announced that this Special Meeting of the City Council was called for the purpose of amending a motion made and carried at a Regular Meeting held March 11, 1947, approving Final Map of Tract No. 14016 (Kettler Knolls).

Councilman Tolson moved to amend a motion made and carried at a Regular Meeting held March 11, 1947 approving Final Map of Tract No. 14016 (Kettler Knolls) to read: "the omission of the name "Standard Oil Company" as owner of an easement over a portion of said Tract is also approved."
