MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING
OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF
THE CITY OF TORRANCE

The City Council of the City of Torrance convened in a Regular Meeting in the Council Chamber of the City Hall at 8:00 o'clock p.m. on Tuesday, May 23, 1950, Mayor Haggard presiding.

Those responding to roll call by City Clerk Bartlett were:
COUNCILMEN: Blount, Drale, Powell, Spelman and Haggard. Also present were City Manager Stevens and City Attorney Smith.

All persons present in the Council Chamber participated in the salute to our Flag.

Mayor Haggard announced the time had come for the opening of truck bids and Clerk Bartlett proceeded to open and read the following:

Councilman Drale moved that Schultz & Peckham's bid on the ½ ton pickup be accepted. Motion, seconded by Councilman Powell, carried unanimously by roll call vote. Councilman Blount moved that the 1½ ton truck be purchased from Paul's Chevrolet. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried unanimously by roll call vote. Councilman Powell moved that the other two bids be rejected. Motion seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried.

Councilman Spelman moved the minutes of the Regular Meeting of May 9, 1950, be accepted. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

WRITTEN COMMUNICATIONS

The following correspondence was read by Clerk Bartlett:

Letter from the Los Angeles County X-Ray Survey Foundation requesting an appropriation of \$2,564 as the City's share for the support of the project. Councilman Powell moved the correspondence be referred to the Finance Committee and the City Attorney for drafting the necessary resolution to make the appropriation. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried.

Letter from Mr. George Miller requesting a license for "palmistry" Letters of character reference were attached and Chief Stroh reported his investigation revealed no reason why the license should not be granted. Councilman Powell, stating that it had been the City's policy in the past to prohibit such businesses, moved the request be denied. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried.

Protests by Mr. and Mrs. Aron Wiebe, 17303 So. Atkinson, and Mr. and Mrs. Ralph McBee, 17315 So. Atkinson, against the issuance of a beer license, applied for to the State, at 17312 So. Crenshaw because of the location. Councilman Blount advised the Council that a petition of protest, signed by 185 persons, had been sent to the State Board of Equalization and moved that the Council also register its protest with the Board by airmail, the City Clerk to write the letter. Motion, seconded by Councilman Drale, carried unanimously.

Letter from the Board of Education as to recreational program budget for 1950-51 and the City's participation. Councilman Drale moved the letter be referred to the Recreation Commission for study and report back to the Council next meeting. Motion, seconded by Councilman Powell, carried.

Claim for damage to personal property by Mrs. S. W. Briggs, 1509 Greenwood, caused by basement being flooded with sewage waste. Councilman Drale moved the communication be referred to the City Attorney

and insurance carrier. Motion was seconded by Councilman Powell. City Attorney Smith advised unless the claim was verified, the Council had no jurisdiction to act. Motion and second were withdrawn. Councilman Powell moved that the City Clerk notify Mrs. Briggs accordingly. Motion, seconded by Councilman Drale, carried.

Letter from Richman Bros., 8687 Wilshire Blvd., re certain property purchased for taxes and asking for an offer by the City. City Manager Stevens and Clerk Bartlett advised it was a lot 20 feet wide which for years has been used as an alley and their recommendation was that the City make an offer for the property to be made into an alley. Councilman Powell moved the Council be given time to examine the property. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried.

Letter from County Tax Collector re property to be sold at tax sale and suggesting the City request cancellation of delinquent taxes on certain property deeded to it. Councilman Powell moved that the Council enter into an agreement with the State for the purchase of the property for \$1.00 and that the City Attorney be authorized to draw the necessary resolution to request cancellation of back taxes and penalties on property deeded to the City. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Request from Clyde Butterfield for permission to operate a stand for the sale of sun glasses at Hawthorne and 101 Highway. Councilman Drale moved the request be granted. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried.

Letter from Joseph Piatt requesting installation of automatic signals at intersection of Western Ave. and Torrance Blvd. City Manager Stevens reported that the cables were all in and signals would be installed very soon and also at Western Ave. and Sepulveda. Councilman Drale moved the communication be filed and letter sent to Mr. Piatt. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried.

Letter from Superintendent of Recreation Carpenter recommending employment of Mrs. Betty Schaefer and Mr. Russel Williams for the next four Fridays to promote the teen-age activity at Walteria. Councilman Drale moved to concur with the recommendation. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Letter and report from the League of California Cities on waste disposal. Councilman Drale asked that the City Manager prepare a breakdown on the number of houses in the City with sewer connections, cost of garbage pickup, etc., over a period of years, and the cost of the City installing disposal units in the homes. City Manager Stevens reported that at the present time the City figures \$3.00 per unit for garbage pickup, and, at a cost of \$50.00 per disposal unit, it would take 17 years to pay for itself.

The following recommendations were submitted by City Manager Stevens:

APPROPRIATIONS:

1. For the installation of acoustical ceiling in the City Clerk's office, the sum of \$338.00.
2. For the payment to Barnett, Hopen & Smith for engineering services and purchase of assessment record sheets, bond register sheets and bonds for the Walteria Sewer District, the sum of \$1,248.17. (Walteria Sewer District -- final payment)
3. For the purchase of the following equipment, materials and supplies for the Recreation Department to furnish playgrounds and recreation buildings:

4. For the purchase of Police Special Ford Sedan, the sum of \$1,950.00.
5. For the purchase of Chevrolet Sedan for Police Department, the sum of \$1,850.00.
6. That the City purchase a 1/2 ton pickup truck and a 1½ ton stake body truck, in accordance with the bids received May 23, 1950. (From Unappropriated Reserve)

Councilman Powell moved that the Council concur with the recommendations. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

BIDS:

1. That the bid of Walter Wiitanen, which was the low bid in the amount of \$6,335.00, for the construction of a storage room and office for the Recreation Department, be accepted and all other bids be rejected.
2. That an agreement be entered into with the Bert S. Crossland Post No. 170 of the American Legion for the refreshment concession in the Torrance Municipal Ball Park, under the same terms as the agreement for the past year.

Councilman Drale moved that the Council concur with the recommendations. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

TRAFFIC CONTROL:

1. That the City Attorney be authorized to prepare the necessary ordinances to establish the following regulatory signs, in accordance with the recommendation of the Traffic Commission.
 - A. One-way traffic on El Prado Avenue:
 - (1) That the southeast section of El Prado Avenue between Cravens Avenue and Manuel Avenue be established as a one-way street for traffic traveling in a northeasterly direction.
 - (2) That the northwest section of El Prado Avenue between Cravens Avenue and Manuel Avenue be established as a one-way street for traffic traveling in a southwesterly direction.
 - B. That the following STOP signs be established:
 - (1) On both sections of El Prado Avenue at Arlington Avenue.
 - (2) On 234th Street at Western Avenue.
 - (3) On 236th Street at Western Avenue.

(4) On Calle Miradores at Calle Mayor.

Councilman Drale moved that the Council concur with the recommendations. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Letter was read from the City Manager relative to appointments made by him since the last meeting:

1. Robert E. Lamphere, truck driver, promoted to Power Equipment Operator No. 1, to serve his probationary period, effective May 16, 1950, at a compensation of \$253 per month.
2. Samuel F. Webb, Power Equipment Operator No. 1, promoted to Power Equipment Operator No. 2, to serve his probationary period effective May 16, 1950, at a compensation of \$290 per month.
3. Marcella J. Smith to be appointed to serve her probationary period as Police Matron and File Clerk, effective May 24, 1950, at the compensation set up as the first step for said position.
4. The following personnel to be appointed June 19, 1950, for the Summer Recreation Program under the classification and at the rate of pay indicated, in accordance with the recommendation of the Recreation Commission and Recreation Director:

Councilman Spelman moved that the Council concur in the appointments. Motion, seconded by Councilman Powell, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

The following letter from the City Manager was read relative to matters referred to him for investigation and report:

- "1. Letter from Torrance-Lomita Realty Board urging employment of additional inspectors: The Building Inspection personnel has been materially increased and I believe that adequate inspection is being given under the present rate of building. Increased activity may require additional personnel.
- "2. Petition regarding removal of weeds from center parkway strip on Torrance Boulevard: The parkway has been cleaned of unsightly weeds. Consideration should be given to the advisability of narrowing the center strip, or its complete elimination.
- "3. Petition of property owners for maintaining Nance Lane (178th St.) as an open public street: The City Attorney has requested title search of property involved. Appropriate action will be taken when the result of the title search is received."

MEMO

After some discussion as to item 2, Councilman Drale moved the report be accepted. Motion, seconded by Councilman Powell, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Recess was declared at 9:00 p.m. and meeting reconvened at 9:30.

Correspondence from Mr. Lloyd, Secretary of the Planning Commission, and Mr. Patrick, Assistant to City Engineer, was read and the following action taken:

CASE NO. 190: Petition of Truman Browne for a Variance and Conditional Permit to build and construct a neighborhood shopping center facing on Hawthorne Blvd. between 178th Place and 179th St., which is in an A-1 (Light Agricultural) Zone. It is the recommendation of the Planning Commission to deny this application, because of the already existing business zoning in the district.

Councilman Blount moved that the Council concur with the recommendation. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried by the following roll call vote: AYES: COUNCILMEN: Blount, Powell, Spelman and Haggard. NAYS: COUNCILMAN: Drale. Councilman Powell then moved that the Planning Commission submit a map to the Council showing the present zoning for business and their reasons for denying the petition. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried.

CASE NO. 193: Petition of Horlander, Phillips & Croak for a Variance and Conditional Permit to remodel existing buildings and establish and operate a building materials supply yard and retail store, selling a complete line of building material for the home builder, at 3401 Torrance Blvd. between Madrona and Amie Ave. This property is located in an A-1 (Light Agricultural) Zone. It is the recommendation of the Planning Commission to approve this application, with the understanding that no machinery will be situated out in front of the property.

Councilman Powell moved to concur with the recommendation. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

FINAL TRACT MAP NO. 13028, submitted by Mr. Truman Browne, containing 135 lots, located south of Sepulveda Blvd. and directly north of Seaside School. This map was approved by the City Planning Commission on March 21, 1950, but due to the re-alignment of a street it was resubmitted and approved for recommendation to your Body at a post diem meeting of the Planning Commission on May 22, 1950. There are no sanitary sewers available in this district.

Councilman Spelman moved that the map be accepted subject to the posting of the necessary bonds and minor engineering changes. Motion, seconded by Councilman Powell, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

FINAL TRACT MAP NO. 16700, submitted by Mr. Marvin Wagner, located at the northwesterly corner of Crenshaw Blvd., containing 434 lots. This tract was approved for recommendation at the meeting of the Planning Commission on May 2, 1950. Sanitary sewers are to be installed.

Councilman Powell moved that the map be accepted subject to the posting of the necessary bonds and minor engineering changes. Motion, seconded by Councilman Drale, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

FINAL TRACT MAP NO. 16759, submitted by Mr. K. Sande Sennes, located east of Madison St. and south of Pacific Coast Highway, containing 56 lots. This map was approved by the Planning Commission on April 18, 1950, for recommendation to your Body. Sanitary sewers will be installed in this tract.

Councilman Drale moved that the map be accepted subject to the posting of the necessary bonds and minor engineering changes. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

FINAL TRACT MAP NO. 15569, submitted by the Palisades Builders, consisting of 93 lots, located east of Seaside Ranchos and north of Seaside Heights. This map was recommended for approval with the provision that retaining walls be placed on all required locations where needed to prevent erosion and provide proper planting areas. No sanitary sewers are available.

Councilman Powell moved for the acceptance of the map only after the City Manager, the Assistant to the City Engineer, and a committee appointed have approved of the necessary retaining walls. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

FINAL TRACT MAP NO. 16850, submitted by Rudolph W. Mayer, consisting of 82 lots located north of Palos Verdes Estates and west of Tract No. 10306. This map was recommended for approval, subject to the following terms of performance as stated by the subdivider's representative, Mr. Rudolph Mayer:

- (a) A minimum floor area of 1200 square feet.
- (b) All public utilities to be underground and sanitary sewers to be installed.
- (c) That the previous negotiations with the Sunhaven Properties Corporation be reviewed by the City Attorney's office and that he recommend to the Planning Commission and City Council that Sunhaven Properties has performed in accordance with their agreement of May 25, 1948, with the City of Torrance, and in the event that such agreement has not been met, this map will not be recommended for approval.

Councilman Powell moved that the map be withheld until such time as the Council has a letter of release from the City Attorney, the City Manager, and a letter of recognition from the Huntington Land Company. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, was discussed by Councilman Drale who felt the subdivision should not be delayed. Motion carried by the following roll call vote: AYES: COUNCILMEN: Blount, Powell, Spelman and Haggard. NAYS: COUNCILMAN: Drale.

A letter was read from Mr. J. S. Cummings requesting waiver of the sidewalk requirement in his contemplated subdivision in Hollywood Riviera. Councilman Powell moved that no exception be made and that sidewalks be required. Motion, seconded by Councilman Drale, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Clerk Bartlett read title to:

Councilman Powell moved further reading of the Ordinance be dispensed with. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried unanimously by roll call vote. Councilman Powell moved for the adoption of Ordinance No. 509 at its second and final reading. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

ORDINANCE NO. 510

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE AMENDING LAND USE ORDINANCE NO. 316, RECLASSIFYING THAT CERTAIN PROPERTY DESCRIBED IN PLANNING COMMISSION CASE NO. 184.

Councilman Powell moved further reading of the Ordinance be dispensed with. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried unanimously by roll call vote. Councilman Powell moved for the adoption of Ordinance No. 510 at its second and final reading. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

ORDINANCE NO. 511

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE AMENDING LAND USE ORDINANCE NO. 316, RECLASSIFYING THAT CERTAIN PROPERTY DESCRIBED IN PLANNING COMMISSION CASE NO. 187.

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Councilman Powell moved further reading of the Ordinance be dispensed with. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried unanimously by roll call vote. Councilman Powell moved for the adoption of Ordinance No. 511 at its second and final reading. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

RESOLUTION NO. 2063

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION TO ORDER THE VACATION OF THE ALLEYS IN SHADY NOOK TRACT, IN THE CITY OF TORRANCE

Councilman Drale moved to dispense with further reading of the Resolution. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried unanimously by roll call vote. Councilman Drale moved for the adoption of Resolution No. 2063. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

RESOLUTION NO. 2064

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE RELATIVE TO THE PROPOSED INITIATIVE MEASURE EXEMPTING ALL PERSONAL PROPERTY FROM TAXATION.

Councilman Powell moved to dispense with further reading of the Resolution. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried unanimously by roll call vote. Councilman Powell moved for the adoption of Resolution No. 2064. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried unanimously by roll call vote. At the request of Mayor Haggard, City Attorney Smith then explained to the audience that if such exemption measure were adopted, the burden would be transferred to real property owners as the revenue would still have to be raised. Councilman Powell then moved that the City Attorney draft a synopsis of the Resolution for publication. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

ORAL COMMUNICATIONS

City Manager Stevens advised that Mr. Cotton, the auditor, had prepared a report on the bus system and wished to meet with the Council and Bus Superintendent. Councilman Powell moved that the time be set for May 31st at 7:00 p.m. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried.

City Attorney Smith, at some length, advised the Council and the audience of the memorandum opinion of Judge Arnold Praeger (in connection with the election contest) in which the Judge states that Torrance "is a city of the sixth class". Mr. Smith explained what this would mean to the citizens of Torrance if allowed to be entered in the judgment -- a lot of time, energy and money spent for nothing by the City and the State as we were already a sixth class city before adopting our charter, no control over our schools, etc.

Councilman Blount nominated Fred Cook and Gordon Mothersell to fill the vacancies on the Civil Service Commission. Motion was seconded by Councilman Spelman. Councilman Drale again submitted the name of Mr. Elder, whose term has expired. Councilman Powell moved that the candidates be discussed by the Council and appointment made at the next regular meeting. Motion, seconded by Councilman Drale, was defeated by the following roll call vote: AYES: COUNCILMEN: Drale and Powell. NAYS: COUNCILMEN: Blount, Spelman and Haggard. ABSENT: COUNCILMEN: None.

Councilman Powell moved that the City Attorney be instructed to draw a resolution, as strong as deemed necessary, objecting to the Regional Planning Commission granting a permit to Ben Kazarian for the operation of a dump at the old Dicalite location. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried. City Manager Stevens reported that he had called the Regional Planning Commission to register a protest on behalf of the City and had asked that we receive official notice of the hearing.

On behalf of the personnel of the Fire Department, Councilman Powell moved that permission be given them to dedicate a tree at McMaster Park to the late Fire Chief. Motion, seconded by Councilman Drale, carried.

Councilman Spelman nominated James Hall to fill the vacancy on the Planning Commission. Councilman Drale re-submitted the names of Mr. Olding and Mr. Olsen.

Councilman Spelman moved that the Traffic Commission make a study of the intersection at 190th and Western, which he feels is a definite hazard. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried.

Councilman Drale asked for the City Manager's recommendation as to the hiring of teen-agers to keep the grass in the parkways cut, etc. Mr. Stevens replied that he thought it would be better to occupy teen-agers in the summer recreation program.

Councilman Drale moved that the necessary attention be given to the following streets: Arlington, Cota, Portola and Cravens north of Torrance Blvd. Motion, seconded by Councilman Powell, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Councilman Drale moved that a letter sent to the State Public Utilities Commission against any increase in telephone, gas or electric rates. Motion, seconded by Councilman Powell, carried.

On motion of Councilman Powell, duly seconded and carried, Mayor Haggard set the time for public hearing on Planning Commission Case No. 189 and for hearing of protests to the vacation of the alleys in Shady Nook Tract as June 13, 1950, at 8:00 p.m.

Mayor Haggard moved that the Council accept the resignation of Mr. Gianni as Chairman of the Planning Commission. Discussion followed, resulting in the withdrawal of the motion until such time as the resignation was received in writing.

Mayor Haggard moved that Mr. Mothersell and Mr. Cook be appointed to the Civil Service Board. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried by the following roll call vote: AYES: COUNCILMEN: Blount, Spelman and Haggard. NAYS: COUNCILMEN: Drale and Powell. ABSENT: COUNCILMEN: None

Mayor Haggard moved that Mr. Jim Hall be appointed to fill the vacancy on the Planning Commission. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried by the following roll call vote: AYES: COUNCILMEN: Blount, Spelman and Haggard. NAYS: COUNCILMEN: Drale and Powell. ABSENT: COUNCILMEN: None.

Councilman Powell entered a protest into the record as to the manner of appointments made to Commissions within the last month.

Mr. Saul, of North Torrance and Valley Center, San Diego County, made inquiry into the legality of the excavation presently under way in North Torrance by Builders Brick and Councilman Drale advised him that permission to excavate had been given in return for a deed to the City of 5 acres of ground to be used by the City for a cut-and-cover dump when the excavation has been completed. Lengthy discussion followed.

Mr. J. Austin Beesley, of Walteria, reminded the Council of a previous pledge that the next vacancy on the Planning Commission would be filled from that district.

Councilman Powell moved all bills properly audited be paid. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried unanimously by roll call vote.
