MINUTES OF AN ADJOURNED REGULAR
MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL
OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE

The City Council of the City of Torrance convened in an Adjourned Regular Meeting, in the Council Chamber of the City Hall, at 8:00 p.m. on Tuesday, October 17, 1950, Mayor Haggard presiding.

Those responding to roll call by City Clerk Bartlett were:
COUNCILMEN: Blount, Drale, Powell, Spelman and Haggard. Also present were City Manager Stevens and City Attorney Smith.

All persons present participated in the salute to our Flag.

As first order of business, Councilman Blount moved the minutes of the Regular meeting of September 26th and October 10th be approved. Motion, seconded by Councilman Powell, carried unanimously.

The time being 8:00 p.m., Mayor Haggard announced the hour had arrived for the third and final public hearing on Planning Commission Case No. 165, petition of Palisades Builders for a Change of Zone. City Manager Stevens read the notice of public hearing, after which Councilman Blount read the recommendation of the Planning Commission denying the request for business zoning as the site was not suitable, due to its location near the Seaside Rancho school. Mayor Haggard called for oral communications. There being none, Councilman Powell moved the hearing be declared closed and the petition be denied. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

WRITTEN COMMUNICATIONS

Clerk Bartlett read the following:

Letter from Mrs. Grace McMaster, expressing appreciation in behalf of her family and herself for dedication of North Torrance Park as a memorial to her husband. Matter of record.

Request of Community Airports, Inc. for a variance from the usual procedure regarding subdivision bonds, on their El Camino Gardena Tract No. 15757 at Redondo Beach Boulevard and Prairie Avenue, asking that permission be given to provide a separate bond for each of the two units contemplated and that the privilege of withdrawing the bond for the second unit, in the event conditions do not permit continued development, be approved. Their reason for the request being that they have a favorable commitment on the entire tract.

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Councilman Spelman moved the matter be referred to the City Attorney for a legal recommendation. Motion, seconded by Councilman Powell, carried unanimously. Mr. J. L. Henderson, representing the Community Airports, Inc., urged approval be given, subject to a favorable recommendation from the City Attorney, in order not to lose more time in recording the map. City Attorney Smith replied that he would like to have time to study the matter, as the Ordinance is tied in with the Business and Professional Code of the State of California.

Letter from Ocean Hills, Inc., asking relief from conditions which were holding up the development of Tract No. 16850, located in Hollywood Riviera. The three conditions were acted upon as follows:

(a) "The Hollywood Parkway abandonment offered by the City has in it certain restrictions regarding easements which prevent us from gaining access to our property abutting on this abandoned parkway. It is our belief that this easement restriction might be lifted or replaced, so that we might gain access to our property".

Councilman Powell moved that the City Attorney be authorized to draft the necessary Quitclaim Deed, to be executed by the City of Torrance quitclaiming all right, title and interest in and to the present reservation of record of easement in this particular tract. Motion, seconded by Councilman Drale, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

(b) "A satisfactory settlement of the two and one-half acre cloud on the title of the property."

Councilman Powell moved that City Manager Stevens and City Attorney Smith be given authority to negotiate for the sale of the two and one-half acres, in return for the purchase of land more suitable for use by the City, negotiations to be in collaboration with the City Council. Motion, seconded by Councilman Drale, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

(c) "The topography of the Tract, being primarily hillside development, is not suited for the installation of sidewalks. It is our belief that the elimination of sidewalks would not be an undue exception to the subdivision ordinance. It is our understanding that the Planning Commission has previously unanimously approved of this exception, but that the communication to the Council did not request a resolution amending said subdivision ordinance."

Councilman Powell moved that the City Attorney be authorized to draft an ordinance, amending the subdivision ordinance, deleting the sidewalk requirement for Tract No. 16850 only. Motion, seconded by Councilman Drale, carried by the following roll call vote: AYES: COUNCILMEN: Drale, Powell and Haggard. NAYS: COUNCILMEN: Blount and Spelman. ABSENT: COUNCILMEN: None.

Letter from Hollywood Riviera Homeowners Association, favoring no deviation in the provisions of Ordinance No. 437 in Tract No. 16850. Matter of record.

Request of Mr. Truman Browne that his Planning Commission Case No. 190, for Variance and Conditional Permit, be reconsidered by the Planning Commission.

Councilman Drale moved that the communication be referred to the Planning Commission. Motion, seconded by Mr. Powell, carried unanimously.

Recreation Commission report, submitting list of part-time employees for after-school and Saturday program.

Councilman Powell moved that the Council concur with the recommendations of the Recreation Commission. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Expense accounts from City Treasurer covering the months of August and September, in the amount of \$25.00 each.

Councilman Drale moved that the accounts be paid. Motion, seconded by Councilman Powell, lost by the following roll call vote: AYES: COUNCILMEN: Drale and Powell. NAYS: COUNCILMEN: Blount, Spelman and Haggard. ABSENT: COUNCILMEN: None.

Letter from Recreation Commission, advising the majority of Commission members protest the passage of Ordinance No. 538, as it is discriminatory and deprives them of their civic rights.

Councilman Drale moved that the communication be filed as a matter of record. Motion, seconded by Councilman Powell, carried unanimously.

Letter from Civil Service Board, protesting the passage of Ordinance No. 538, as the members unanimously feel that it is discriminatory and deprives them of their civic rights.

Councilman Drale moved that the communication be filed as a matter of record. Motion, seconded by Councilman Powell, carried unanimously.

Letter from the Torrance Better Merchants, advising that their Board of Directors had gone on record as opposing Proposition No. 1, to be voted upon at the November election. Matter of record.

Application of Pacific Telephone Company for authority to increase rates.

Councilman Drale moved that the City Council go on record as protesting any raise in rates and that the City Manager write a letter to the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California, advising them of the protest. Motion, seconded by Councilman Powell, carried unanimously.

Request from Disabled American Veterans to sell the customary memorial flower, "for-get-me-not", during National Forget-Me-Not-Week, November 8th through the 11th.

Councilman Spelman moved the request be granted. Motion, seconded by Councilman Drale, carried unanimously.

Request from Rev. S. O. Whitman to use the house on the southeast side of Torrance Park, temporarily as a Sunday School.

Councilman Powell moved that the request be granted, provided that there is no interference with the meeting already scheduled by the Boy Scouts and other youth groups and that the non-denominational policy set forth in previous rulings be adhered to. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried unanimously.

Request of Torrance Unified School District for free use of the Civic Auditorium for an Adult Concert Orchestra on Friday, November 10, 1950.

Councilman Powell moved that the request be granted. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried unanimously.

Request of the American Red Cross for free use of the Civic Auditorium on December 1, 1950, for a Blood Bank.

Councilman Powell moved the request be granted. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried unanimously.

Request of First Church of Christ, Scientist, for free use of the Civic Auditorium on February 15, 1951, for a free Christian Science Lecture.

Mayor Haggard informed the Council that City Manager Stevens was planning on setting up a certain nominal fee to be paid by all users of the Auditorium, for clean-up expense, such policy to go into effect the first of the year.

Councilman Powell moved the request be granted, subject to the policy effective on January 1, 1951. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried unanimously.

Request of National Supply for use of the Civic Auditorium on December 23, 1950, from 11:00 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. for a Christmas Party for the employees' children between the ages of one year and twelve years old.

Councilman Drale moved the request be granted. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried unanimously.

Request of National Brotherhood of Operative Potters for use of the Civic Auditorium for a benefit program, the entire proceeds from which will be donated to a fellow member and resident of Torrance, who was injured last March and has not been able to return to work. Recreation Director Carpenter approved November 8, 1950, as the time.

Councilman Drale moved the request be granted and that a \$10 clean-up fee be charged. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried unanimously.

Request of Church of Jesus Christ Latter Day Saints for refund of \$50.00 paid for use of Civic Auditorium kitchen facilities for dinner July 27th.

Councilman Drale moved the City refund the \$50.00. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

At 9:05 p.m., Mayor Haggard declared a five-minute recess. The meeting reconvened at 9:10 p.m.

Letter from City Manager Stevens, recommending that the City Council request the Board of Directors of the Veterans' Emergency Rentals, Inc., place \$1,500.00 in a special trust fund to insure payment of expenses incurred by the final removal and disposition of the housing units located at the Torrance Municipal Airport, and a restoration of the entire site to its original condition.

Councilman Spelman moved the Council concur with the recommendation of the City Manager. Motion, seconded by Councilman Powell, carried unanimously.

Letter from City Manager Stevens, recommending a \$10.00 cost-of-living bonus be granted to all City employees, except Department Heads, effective November 1, 1950, and continuing through the present fiscal

year, with the provision that this bonus not be granted if Proposition No. 1 on the State ballot is passed on November 7, 1950. Mr. Stevens also recommended that steps be taken toward equalizing the pay of Department Heads, who have comparable responsibilities.

Councilman Powell moved that a \$10.00 raise be granted all City employees, with the exception of Department Heads, effective October 1, 1950, omitting any reference to the passage of Proposition No. 1 on the State ballot, and that steps be taken toward equalizing the pay of Department Heads, who have comparable responsibilities. Motion, seconded by Councilman Drale, lost by the following roll call vote: AYES: COUNCILMEN: Drale and Powell. NAYS: COUNCILMEN: Blount, Spelman and Haggard. ABSENT: COUNCILMEN: None.

Councilman Blount moved the Council concur with the recommendation of City Manager Stevens. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Recommendations of City Manager Stevens:

PERSONNEL:

1. That Winfred E. Lawson be temporarily employed as Sewer Inspector, to assist Plumbing Inspector, effective October 13, 1950, at a compensation of \$242 per month.

Councilman Powell moved the Council concur with the recommendation of City Manager Stevens. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

APPROPRIATIONS:

1. For the purchase of Gar Wood Packer on G.M.C. Truck, the sum of \$8,150.00 plus sales tax.
2. For the purchase of materials for improving Abalone Avenue, the sum of \$1,600.94. (From County Gas Tax Funds)
3. For the purchase of materials for improving alleys, the sum of \$1,015.68. (From County Gas Tax Funds)
4. For the payment of engineering services to Barclay Surveying Company, the sum of \$305.00.

Councilman Spelman moved the Council concur with the recommendations under Appropriations. Motion, seconded by Councilman Powell, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

TRAFFIC CONTROL:

That the City Attorney be authorized to prepare the necessary ordinance to establish the following regulatory signs in accordance with the recommendations of the Traffic Committee.

1. That Stop signs be established as follows:
 - (a) Two-way Stop on 171st Street at Yukon Avenue.
 - (b) Four-way Stop at Sepulveda Boulevard and Arlington Avenue.

Councilman Spelman moved the Council concur with the recommendations under Traffic Control. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Request of City Clerk for authority to destroy obsolete records, which had been approved by the City Attorney.

City Clerk Bartlett stated that this request should be approved by Resolution, as follows:

Councilman Spelman moved further reading of the Resolution be dispensed with. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried unanimously by roll call vote. Councilman Spelman moved for the adoption of Resolution No. 2100. Motion, seconded by Councilman Powell, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

City Clerk Bartlett read title to the following:

RESOLUTION NO. 2101

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE DECLARING THE OFFICIAL DEPOSITORIES OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE, SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS IN THIS RESOLUTION CONTAINED.

Councilman Drale moved further reading of the Resolution be dispensed with. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried unanimously by roll call vote. Councilman Drale moved for the adoption of Resolution No. 2101. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

RESOLUTION NO. 2102

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE WAIVING CERTAIN PROPERTY REQUIREMENTS.

City Clerk Bartlett read the Resolution in full. Councilman Drale moved for the adoption of Resolution No. 2102. Motion, seconded by Councilman Powell. Councilman Blount stated that the Council had acted on this matter a short time ago and the vote had been four to one, Councilman Drale dissenting. The motion carried by the following roll call vote: AYES: COUNCILMEN: Drale, Powell and Haggard. NAYS: COUNCILMEN: Blount and Spelman. ABSENT: COUNCILMEN: None.

RESOLUTION NO. 2103

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND CITY CLERK TO EXECUTE THAT CERTAIN GRANT DEED TO ROME CABLE CORPORATION AND RESCINDING RESOLUTION NO. 2085.

RESOLUTION NO. 2106

Councilman Blount moved further reading of the Resolution be dispensed with. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried unanimously by roll call vote. Councilman Blount moved for the adoption of Resolution No. 2106. Motion, seconded by Councilman Drale, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

RESOLUTION NO. 2107

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE, CALIFORNIA, REQUESTING THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS TO MAKE ALLOCATION OF "AID TO CITIES" (GASOLINE TAX FUNDS,) FOR STREET IMPROVEMENTS AS HEREINAFTER SET FORTH.

Councilman Drale moved further reading of the Resolution be dispensed with. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried unanimously. Councilman Powell moved for the adoption of Resolution No. 2107. Motion, seconded by Councilman Drale, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

RESOLUTION NO. 2108

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ASSIGNMENT BY SAID CITY FROM ITS ALLOCATION OF STATE FUNDS UNDER CHAPTER 20, STATUTES OF 1946, (FIRST EXTRA SESSION) "CONSTRUCTION AND IMPROVEMENT ACT" TO COUNTY SANITATION DISTRICT NO. 5 OF LOS ANGELES COUNTY, THE SUM OF FOUR THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED SEVENTY-SIX DOLLARS AND FORTY-SEVEN CENTS (\$4,176.47)

Councilman Spelman moved further reading of the Resolution be dispensed with. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried unanimously by roll call vote. Councilman Spelman moved for the adoption of Resolution No. 2108. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

RESOLUTION NO. 2109

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ASSIGNMENT BY SAID CITY FROM ITS ALLOCATION OF STATE FUNDS UNDER CHAPTER 47, STATUTES OF 1944 (FOURTH EXTRA SESSION) TO COUNTY SANITATION DISTRICT NO. 5 OF LOS ANGELES COUNTY, THE SUM OF TWO THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED EIGHTY-ONE DOLLARS AND FIFTY-FOUR CENTS (\$2,181.54).

Councilman Spelman moved further reading of the Resolution be dispensed with. Motion, seconded by Councilman Drale, carried

unanimously by roll call vote. Councilman Spelman moved for the adoption of Resolution No. 2109. Motion, seconded by Councilman Powell, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

ORDINANCE NO. 537

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE AMENDING LAND USE ORDINANCE NO. 316, RECLASSIFYING THAT CERTAIN PROPERTY DESCRIBED IN PLANNING COMMISSION CASE NO. 196.

Councilman Powell moved that further reading of the Ordinance be dispensed with. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried unanimously by roll call vote. Councilman Powell moved for the adoption of Ordinance No. 537 at its second and final reading. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

ORDINANCE NO. 538

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE RELATING TO APPOINTIVE OFFICES.

Councilman Powell said he had heard that the only reason for introducing such an Ordinance was to keep officials from using their appointments as a political office, and moved that the Ordinance be referred to the City Attorney for rewording or deleting of Section 1. The motion died for lack of a second.

Councilman Spelman moved further reading of the Ordinance be dispensed with. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, lost by the following roll call vote: AYES: COUNCILMEN: Blount, Spelman and Haggard. NAYS: COUNCILMEN: Drale and Powell. ABSENT: COUNCILMEN: None.

City Clerk Bartlett read the Ordinance in full.

Councilmen Drale and Powell voiced their objection to such an Ordinance, as it was discriminating against persons the Council had appointed to serve the City on various boards and commissions. Councilman Drale stated he wanted to go on record as definitely opposing any such Ordinance and that it would be proper for Mayor Haggard to resign, should this Ordinance be passed, as he was the only member of the Council who had come directly to the Council from a Commission, having been serving on the City Planning Commission when elected to the Council.

Councilman Powell moved the Ordinance be referred back to the City Attorney and that any action on it be withheld at this time. Motion, seconded by Councilman Drale, lost by the following roll call vote: AYES: COUNCILMEN: Drale and Powell. NAYS: COUNCILMEN: Blount, Spelman and Haggard. ABSENT: COUNCILMEN: None.

Councilman Spelman moved for the adoption of Ordinance No. 538 at its second and final reading. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried by the following roll call vote: AYES: COUNCILMEN: Blount, Spelman and Haggard. NAYS: COUNCILMEN: Drale and Powell. ABSENT: COUNCILMEN: None.

ORAL COMMUNICATIONS

City Manager Stevens stated that at a Regular Meeting held on September 26, 1950, Tract Map No. 13028, submitted by Mr. Truman Browne, located north of Seaside School and approved by the Council on May 31, 1950, was re-submitted to the Council for re-approval, due to the fact that two owners had signed it at a date subsequent to the original approval. The map was held up at this time to determine if sanitary sewers were available. On October 3, 1950, it was determined that sanitary sewer disposal was not available within one mile and it is impracticable to sewer this tract. However, the sewer disposal will require a septic tank and a cesspool, which Mr. Stevens recommended for this tract. Also, it is necessary that future streets in this tract be rejected under the provisions of Section No. 11616 of the Subdivision Map Act.

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Councilman Powell moved that Tract Map No. 13028 be re-approved, with a combination septic tank and cesspool sewage disposal, as recommended by City Manager Stevens. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

City Manager Stevens stated that at the same time, Tracts No. 16962 and No. 16963 were returned to the Council, as the City of Torrance has an easement for a water line across Lot 19, which necessitates an approval by the City Council. Councilman Blount moved that these tracts be held over to the next regular meeting, as good news regarding a sewer lateral nearby had been received. Motion, seconded by Councilman Drale, carried unanimously.

City Manager Stevens reminded the Council that next Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, October 23rd, 24th and 25th, are the days on which the League of California Cities State Convention is to be held in Los Angeles and urged the members to plan to attend as many sessions as possible. He suggested that the next meeting of the Council, which falls on Tuesday, October 24, be set for some other date which would be convenient for all members to attend.

City Attorney Smith stated that he had been giving some thought to the Nuccio dairy case, and since Mr. Nuccio had purchased approximately two and one-half acres of land after the original purchase from Mr. Costa, there was a violation in enlarging a non-conforming use, and asked for instruction from the Council. Councilman Blount suggested that this be discussed at the next Agenda meeting.

Councilman Blount moved that the next Regular meeting of the City Council be held on October 31, 1950. Motion, seconded by Councilman Drale, carried unanimously.

Councilman Drale stated that there were several tracts, in the outlying districts, which had no street signs as yet and asked if signs could be installed. City Manager Stevens explained that he had planned to place a sign at every intersection, but that it had seemed proper to first take the main intersections and streets that had existed twenty-five years.

Councilman Drale recommended to the Traffic Committee that a Stop sign be placed at Arlington and 164th Street and that a speed limit sign be placed on 164th Street.

Councilman Powell said he had received information, while at the Harbor General Hospital, that Torrance was at present without ambulance service closer than Redondo Beach. He suggested that City Manager Stevens take steps to provide a better service and report at the next meeting, keeping in mind that there are several capable Firemen with experience which makes possible the organization of an ambulance service within the City forces.

William A. Lewis, 720 Border Avenue, reported two dangerous crossings, due to cars parked on the street and to insufficient lighting. He asked that these crossings be investigated and was assured by Mayor Haggard that the matter would be taken up at the next Traffic Committee meeting.

Jack Baldwin of the Torrance Herald asked if it was possible to find out why traffic lights had not been installed at Western Avenue and Sepulveda Boulevard, as they had been put in at intersections less hazardous, such as 220th Street and Western Avenue. City Manager Stevens assured him that a light for Sepulveda Boulevard had been on the original plan, but that the City of Los Angeles was installing the traffic lights so it would be necessary to contact them for the information, which he would do.

Councilman Spelman moved all bills properly audited be paid. Motion, seconded by Councilman Drale, carried unanimously by roll call vote.
