The City Council of the City of Torrance convened in a Special Meeting on Tuesday, March 6, 1951, at 8:00 p.m. in the Council Chamber of the City Hall, Mayor Haggard presiding.

Those responding to roll call by City Clerk Bartlett were:
COUNCILMEN: Blount, Drale, Karlow, Spelman and Haggard. Also present were City Manager Stevens and City Attorney Hall.

This being a Special Meeting, the regular order of business was dispensed with and Mayor Haggard announced the meeting had been called for the purpose of considering the adoption of a resolution requesting the County Board of Supervisors to recommend a sufficient number of Municipal Court Judges under the proposed judicial district for the South Bay Area.


Clerk Bartlett read title to:

RESOLUTION NO. 2158


A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE REQUESTING THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS TO RECOMMEND A SUFFICIENT NUMBER OF MUNICIPAL COURT JUDGES TO ADEQUATELY SERVE THE PEOPLE RESIDING WITHIN THE JUDICIAL DISTRICT TO BE ESTABLISHED SERVING THE CITY OF TORRANCE AND OTHER COMMUNITIES.

Councilman Blount moved to dispense with further reading of the Resolution. Motion, seconded by Councilman Karlow, carried unanimously by roll call vote. Councilman Spelman moved for the adoption of Resolution No. 2158. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

There being no further business, Councilman Blount moved meeting be adjourned. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried unanimously.
