MINUTES OF A SPECIAL MEETING  
OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF  
THE CITY OF TORRANCE

The City Council of the City of Torrance convened in a Special Meeting in the Council Chamber of the City Hall on Wednesday, February 6, 1952, at 8:00 P.M., Mayor Haggard presiding.

Those responding to roll call by City Clerk Bartlett were: COUNCILMEN: Blount, Drale, Karlow and Haggard. ABSENT: COUNCILMEN: Spelman. Also present were City Manager Stevens and City Attorney Hall.

This being a Special Meeting, the regular order of business was dispensed with and Mayor Haggard announced the meeting had been called for the purpose of reapproving Tract Map 17041 and considering final map of Tract No. 17869, and any other business which might come before the Council.

City Manager Stevens, in reviewing Tract No. 17041, stated re-approval of the map was necessary before submission to the County as some of the owners had signed the map subsequent to the Council's previous approval, and that there were no changes in the map itself. Councilman Blount moved the Council reapprove Tract No. 17041 under the same restrictions and conditions set forth in the former approval. Motion, seconded by Councilman Drale, carried by the unanimous roll call vote of those present.

City Manager Stevens presented Tract No. 17369 by submitting the map for study and reading the recommendation of the Planning Commission. Each Councilman was furnished with a copy of a letter from Assistant to City Engineer Patrick recommending approval of the tract map upon certain conditions. Councilman Drale moved the Council concur in the recommendations of approval, subject to the conditions set forth in Mr. Patrick's letter. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried by the unanimous roll call vote of those present.


ORAL COMMUNICATIONS

Councilman Drale, stating that most of the nearby communities had given salary increases recently to their employees, and that the City of Torrance should do likewise as the cost of living was still rising, moved the employees be given a "10% boost in their salaries immediately". Mayor Haggard stated that, while he agreed an increase should be considered, he did not believe any set figure should be named until the Council knew how much money might be available, and that he had asked the City Manager, a week or ten days ago, to make such an analysis of available funds. There being no second to Mr. Drale's motion, same was declared lost.

There being no further business, at 8:20 P.M. Councilman Blount moved the meeting be adjourned. Motion, seconded by Councilman Karlow, carried unanimously.
