MINUTES OF AN ADJOURNED REGULAR  
MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL  
OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE

The City Council of the City of Torrance convened in an Adjourned Regular Meeting in the Council Chamber of the City Hall on Wednesday, June 18, 1952, at 8:07 P.M., Mayor Schwab presiding.

Those responding to roll call by City Clerk Bartlett were: COUNCILMEN: Benstead, Blount, Drale, Spelman and Schwab. Also present were City Manager Stevens and City Attorney Hall.

Councilman Benstead led the salute to the Flag.

This being an adjourned regular meeting, Councilman Blount moved the regular order of business be dispensed with. Motion, seconded by Councilman Spelman, carried.

Mayor Schwab announced that the time had arrived for the opening of bids on the 4-Door Sedan, 2-Ton Truck Chassis, 19000# GVW Truck Chassis, Gar Wood Load Packer, and Dump Truck Body, and Clerk Bartlett opened and read the following:

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Mr. Stevens suggested that a determination of the low bids could be made during a short recess and awards made later in the evening.

Mayor Schwab asked City Attorney Hall to make a statement regarding the Seaside Heights Sewer District. City Attorney Hall stated that the resolution is not in correct form to reduce the assessment for the Seaside Heights Sewer District by the amount of State monies that we can obtain, and secondly, regarding the ordinance, we are working on additional properties which might be assessed under this district and the ordinance will be completed in a few days. He said that both the resolution and the ordinance would probably be presented at the next Council Meeting, June 24, 1952.

Mayor Schwab declared a recess at 8:25 P.M. and the meeting reconvened at 8:37 P.M.

The bids having been studied, Councilman Drale moved that the bid of Schultz & Peckham in the amount of \$1746.95 (not including sales tax or extras) for a 1952 Ford 6 Mainline 4-Door Sedan be accepted and all other bids for this item be rejected. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Councilman Drale moved that the bid of International Harvester Company in the amount of \$2184.64 (not including sales tax or extras) for a 2-Ton Truck Chassis be accepted and all other bids for this item be rejected. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Councilman Drale moved that the bid of International Harvester Company in the amount of \$3212.18 (not including sales tax or extras) for the 19,000# GVW Truck Chassis be accepted and all other bids for this item be rejected. Motion, seconded by Councilman Benstead, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Councilman Drale moved that the bid of Gar Wood Industries in the amount of \$4954.30 (including sales tax) for a Gar Wood Load Packer be accepted. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Councilman Drale moved that the bid of Gar Wood Industries in the amount of \$1452.09 (including sales tax) for a Dump Truck Body be accepted. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Meeting adjourned at 8:40 P.M. on motion of Councilman Blount, seconded by Councilman Spelman, and unanimously carried.
