MINUTES OF AN ADJOURNED REGULAR
MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL
OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE

The City Council of the City of Torrance convened in and adjourned Regular Meeting in the Council Chamber of the City Hall on Tuesday, July 29, 1952, at 8:00 P.M.. Mayor Schwab presiding.

Those responding to roll call by City Clerk Bartlett were:
COUNCILMEN: Benstead, Blount, Drale and Schwab. ABSENT: Spelman.
Also present was City Attorney Hall.

Councilman Blount led the salute to our Flag.

This being an adjourned Regular Meeting, Councilman Blount moved to dispense with the regular order of business. Motion, seconded by Councilman Benstead, carried.

Mayor Schwab announced that this was the time set for the hearing on the proposed annexation of a portion of Kettler Estates. Clerk Bartlett reported he had received no written protests. Oral protests were called for. There being none, Councilman Drale moved all protests be denied and the hearing closed. Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried by the unanimous roll call vote of those present. Councilman Blount moved the City Attorney be authorized and directed to prepare the necessary ordinance in connection with this annexation. Motion, seconded by Councilman Drale, carried by the unanimous roll call vote of those present.

Clerk Bartlett read title to:

ORDINANCE NO. 607

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE AMENDING LAND USE ORDINANCE NO. 316, RECLASSIFYING THAT CERTAIN PROPERTY DESCRIBED IN PLANNING COMMISSION CASE NO. 237.

Councilman Blount moved to dispense with further reading of the Ordinance. Motion, seconded by Councilman Benstead, carried by the unanimous roll call vote of those present. Councilman Blount moved for the adoption of Ordinance No. 607 at its second and final reading. Motion, seconded by Councilman Benstead, carried by the unanimous roll call vote of those present.

ORDINANCE NO. 608

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE PROHIBITING THE DYEING OR COLORING OF DOMESTIC ANIMALS OR FOWLS.

Councilman Blount moved to dispense with further reading of the Ordinance. Motion, seconded by Councilman Benstead, carried by the unanimous roll call vote of those present. Councilman Blount moved for the adoption of Ordinance No. 608 at its second and final reading. Motion, seconded by Councilman Drale, carried by the unanimous roll call vote of those present.

ORDINANCE NO. 611

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 462, AS AMENDED BY ORDINANCE NO. 552.

At the request of Councilman Drale, Clerk Bartlett read the Ordinance in its entirety, following which Councilman Blount moved for the adoption of urgency Ordinance No. 611 at its first and final reading. Motion, seconded by Councilman Benstead, carried by the unanimous roll call vote of those present.

ORAL COMMUNICATIONS

Councilman Benstead reported that in the recreation building at the ball park, there was a light fixture hanging by a wire which is a dangerous hazard, and that the plate has been removed from the controlling switch of this light, and moved the matter be referred to the Electrical Department. for immediate attention. Motion, seconded by Councilman Drale, carried.

Jack Baldwin, of the Torrance Herald, suggested that the Traffic Commission consider stop signs at the intersection of Walnut and Huber Streets and also the blind intersection at 235th St. and Walnut. Councilman Blount moved the information be forwarded to the Traffic Commission for its action. Motion, seconded by Councilman Benstead, carried.

There being no further business, Councilman Blount moved all bills properly audited be paid. Motion, seconded by Councilman Drale, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

At 8:13 P.M., Councilman Blount moved the meeting be adjourned Motion, seconded by Councilman Drale, carried.
