MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING  
OF THE TORRANCE CITY COUNCIL

The City Council of the City of Torrance met in a regular session at 5:30 P. M., Tuesday, May 29, 1956, in the Council Chamber, City Hall, Torrance, California.

Those responding to roll call by City Clerk Bartlett were: COUNCILMEN: Benstead, Blount, Drale, Jahn, Isen. City Manager Stevens and City Attorney Hall were also present.

Administrative Assistant Don Mansfield led the salute to our Flag.

Reverend McGuinness opened the meeting with an invocation.

Mayor Isen thanked Reverend McGuinness for his faithful attendance at the Council meetings for the past month.

Councilman Jahn corrected Line 3 of the eighth paragraph under Oral Communications, on Page 14 of the Minutes of the May 22 meeting of the Council as follows: Instead of reading "zoned M-1", the line should read "zoned M-1 and M-2".

Councilman Drale moved to approve the Minutes with the correction made by Councilman Jahn.

Motion seconded by Councilman Benstead, no objection, so ordered.

Mayor Isen announced that the re-count on the April 10, 1956, General Municipal election was made today, and that as a result Mr. Jahn is still a Councilman.

As the first order of business, Mayor Isen read the following Resolution:

Motion, seconded by Councilman Benstead, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Councilman Drale moved for adoption of Resolution No. 2938.

Motion, seconded by Councilman Benstead, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Mayor Isen said a copy would be presented to Milton Hunter, President of the new Lions Club for the archives of the Club.

Mayor Isen announced that this was the time and place fixed for the  
public opening and reading of sealed proposals for performing the work  
for the improvement of Vista Highlands Sewer District.

City Clerk Bartlett presented the affidavits of publication and  
posting Notice Inviting Sealed Proposals.

Councilman Blount moved the affidavits be accepted and filed.

Mayor Isen directed City Manager Stevens to submit the proposals to the City Attorney for examination of bonds, checks, or money, to determine their sufficiency.

As this examination would take some time, Mayor Isen directed that other business be taken in order until the City Attorney was ready to report to the Council.

#### HEARINGS:

Continued Hearing on Assessment for the Construction of Curbs, Gutters, Driveway Aprons and Sidewalks in the Del Amo Boulevard Improvement District.

City Clerk Bartlett presented the affidavits of publication, mailing, and posting of notice.

Councilman Blount moved these be accepted and filed.

Motion seconded by Mayor Isen, no objection, so ordered.

The Mayor asked if any written protests have been filed, and there were none.

Mayor Isen asked if anyone wished to be heard from the floor, but no one came forward.

Councilman Benstead moved to declare the Hearing closed.

Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Councilman Benstead asked City Engineer Bishop if the fence there would be taken care of, and Mr. Bishop said yes.

Councilman Benstead moved to deny any and all appeals or objections.

Motion seconded by Councilman Blount, no objections, so ordered.

Mayor Isen said the Resolution which would now be read should be corrected on Page 2, Line 2, which should read 5:30 P. M., and the document was ordered corrected.

City Clerk Bartlett read:

RESOLUTION NO. 2939

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE, CALIFORNIA, CONFIRMING THE ASSESSMENT LEVIED UPON THE LAND WITHIN THE DEL AMO BOULEVARD IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT TO PAY THE COSTS OF THE IMPROVEMENT OF DEL AMO BOULEVARD BY THE CONSTRUCTION AND INSTALLATION THEREIN OF CURBS, GUTTERS, DRIVEWAY APRONS AND SIDEWALKS.

Councilman Benstead moved to dispense with further reading of the Resolution.

Motion, seconded by Councilman Jahn, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Councilman Benstead moved for adoption of Resolution No. 2939.

Motion, seconded by Councilman Jahn, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

WRITTEN COMMUNICATIONS:

1. A letter dated May 24, 1956, from the Knolls Construction Company, signed by J. E. Kettler, requesting extension of Council approval on Tract 17958, which was originally given on June 7, 1955. The letter asked an extension of one year.

Councilman Drale moved the request be granted.

City Attorney Hall said the authority to do this did not exist, and such a request cannot be granted now.

Mayor Isen ruled the motion out of order.

Councilman Benstead moved the request be denied.

Mayor Isen ruled the motion out of order.

The letter was tabled for further study.

2. A request from the Torrance Mounted Police, signed by Edward D. Aiken, Secretary-Treasurer, dated May 22, 1956, for financial assistance during the coming fiscal year.

Councilman Drale moved to refer this to City Manager Stevens for consideration in conjunction with the budget for the coming fiscal year.

Motion seconded by Mayor Isen, no objections, so ordered.

3. A letter dated May 18, 1956, from the California Sewage and Industrial Wastes Association, signed by Eric V. Quartly, President. This requested that delegates be sent to the National Federation of Sewage and Industrial Wastes Association Annual Conference from October 8 to 11, 1956. The conference will be held in Los Angeles, at the Hotel Statler.

There were no objections, and Mayor Isen ordered this referred to the City Manager for his recommendation.

4. A communication from Evangelistic Churches under date of May 18, 1956, and signed by: the Reverend C. E. Shields of the Victory Assembly of God; the Reverend Zerl Myers of the Faith Chapel; the Reverend V. W. Durbin of the Bethel Chapel; the Reverend W. O. Ziegler of the Assembly of God Tabernacle; and the Reverend Clyde Stockdale and Gene H. May, Associate, of the Evangel Temple. This letter requested permission to hold a United Tent Revival from June 25 to July 20 at the southeast corner of 164th and Crenshaw Boulevards.

The request was referred to the Police and Fire Chiefs for their recommendations.

There were no objections and it was so ordered.

5. A petition dated May 15, 1956, bearing seven signatures, asked the Council to accept a 50-foot street proposed on Tract No. 22795. This street is one block east of Ainsworth and has 168th Street as its northern terminus and is a dead-end street at the south.

There were no objections, and the Mayor ordered this referred to the City Engineer for study and recommendation.

6. A letter dated May 25, 1956, from Sgt. D. C. Cook, Liaison Officer, Torrance Mounted Police, requesting on behalf of the Mounted Police and the Torrance Lions Club, permission to hold a Rodeo August 11 and 12, along with the Dedication ceremonies for the new Civic Center.

Mayor Isen asked Sgt. Cook, who was present, if he had anything to add to this.

Sgt. Cook said the rodeo was planned to coincide with the dedication ceremonies.

Councilman Jahn moved the request be granted, with the usual bond for clean-up fee and insurance to hold the City harmless.

There were no objections, and it was so ordered.

7. A letter dated May 24, 1956, signed by Earle A. Lloyd, Vice President of the Mercury International Companies at 24463 Hawthorne Boulevard, asked the City Council to initiate proceedings for traffic control at Newton and Hawthorne Avenues.

Councilman Jahn said this was supposed to have a sketch with it.

Mr. Pendleton, a businessman in the area near Newton and Hawthorne, said this corner had been studied by the Traffic Commission.

City Engineer Bishop expressed his wish to study this further.

Mr. Pendleton said he and the other business men in the area would be glad to give whatever help they can.

There were no objections, and the matter was referred to City Engineer Bishop, and Chief of Police Haslam for a recommendation as soon as possible,

8. A request dated May 22, 1956, from Josef Milo of 5135 Halison Street for permission to practice hypnosis in Torrance.

This was referred to Chief of Police Haslam and Mr. Mansfield for study and recommendation.

9. A protest dated May 17, 1956, from Mrs. Al Klempan of 23820 Ward Street against the proposed charges at the new Municipal Swimming Pool.

The Mayor referred this to the Director of the Park and Recreation Department for reply, noting that there are no definite schedules of charges yet.

10. A request from R. R. Smith of 1517 Marcelina Avenue, dated May 22, 1956, for a 60-day extension in time for moving out of the home at the address given.

Councilman Blount moved the extension be granted.

Motion seconded by Councilman Jahn, so ordered.

Mayor Isen moved a reasonable rental of \$60.00 a month be charged for the property, with rental prorated to the time the Smith family moves out of the house.

Motion, seconded by Councilman Jahn, failed by the following roll call vote: AYES: COUNCILMEN: Jahn, Isen. NOES: COUNCILMEN: Benstead, Blount, Drale. ABSENT: COUNCILMEN: None.

Councilman Drale moved the City advertise for bids to move the residence at 1517 Marcelina Avenue as soon as possible and the area be paved so it can be used as a parking lot.

Motion seconded by Mayor Isen, no objections, so ordered.

Communications from the City Manager:

The following recommendations made for Council consideration and approval:

PERSONNEL:

1. Robert C. Guerra and Ernest Mata (Nos. 3 and 4 on the Eligible List) were employed as Laborers in the Street Department commencing May 22nd at the first salary step. Nos. 1 and 2 on the Eligible List have failed to respond to offers of employment.
2. James K. McMaster was employed as a Laborer in the Street Department on a temporary basis pending Civil Service examination, commencing May 24th, 1956, at the first salary step. The Eligible List for Laborers has been exhausted, and another examination for Laborers has been ordered and will be given next month.
3. Helen K. Koonse, employed as Stenographer Clerk in the City Attorney's office in a temporary capacity during the illness of Frances Giaquinto, commencing May 21st at the first salary step. Her standing was No. 5 on the Eligible List, but she was the only one willing to accept temporary employment.

Councilman Drale moved to concur with the recommendations of the City Manager.

Motion, seconded by Mayor Isen, carried by the following roll call vote: AYES: COUNCILMEN: Blount, Drale, Jahn, Isen. NOES: COUNCILMEN: None. ABSENT: COUNCILMEN: None. Councilman Benstead said: "Yes on Numbers 1 and 3 under Personnel, and No on No. 2, because I don't see any reason for not having an Eligible List."

VISTA HIGHLANDS SEWER DISTRICT:

At this time, City Attorney Hall said he was prepared to report that the bids on the Vista Highlands Sewer District were all legally sufficient as to form.

Councilman Blount moved these be referred to the City Manager and the City Engineer for study and recommendation to be made to the Council at the regular meeting of June 12, 1956.

Motion seconded by Councilman Jahn, no objections, so ordered.

The second communication from the City Manager was a proposal covering the invitations to the dedication ceremonies of the new City Hall and Police Station on Saturday, August 11, 1956. A list of Governmental officials of the area, numbering 386, was attached, and the letter asked for additions or deletions.

Mayor Isen suggested that the Board of Supervisors of Los Angeles County and their Deputies be invited, as well as the Councilmen of neighboring cities.

City Attorney Hall suggested that the City Attorneys of the area be invited.

Mayor Isen agreed that they should be.

There was no objection, and it was so ordered.

At 6:25 P. M. the Mayor declared a recess, with the Council reconvening at 6:30 P. M.

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ENGINEERING AND PLANNING COMMISSION MATTERS:

1. TENTATIVE TRACT MAP NO. 22912: This item was deleted from the Agenda of tonight's meeting, under instructions carried on the Addendum to the Agenda.

2. FINAL TRACT MAP NO. 22660: Transmittal form from Planning Commission and Engineering Department recommending approval of Final Tract Map No. 22660, located westerly of Arlington Avenue and southerly of 178th Street, containing 46 lots, presented by Mr. George Chacksfield. Attached: (a) Excerpt from Planning Commission Minutes of May 16, 1956; (b) Letter from J. R. Patrick, Ass't. to City Engineer dated May 16, 1956; (c) Letter from Rolling Acres Development Company dated May 10, 1956, (d) Sketch of tract; (e) Pages 8, 9 and 10 of March 20, 1956, Council Minutes.

Councilman Drale moved to concur with the recommendation of the Planning Commission.

Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

3. TENTATIVE TRACT MAP NO. 22712: Transmittal form from Planning Commission and Engineering Department recommending approval of Tentative Tract Map No. 22712, located easterly of Casimir Avenue, northerly of 182nd Street, southerly of 178th Street and westerly of Tentative Tracts Nos. 22660 and 22758. Attached: (a) Excerpt from Planning Commission Minutes of May 16, 1956; (b) L. A. County Flood Control District letter of February 27, 1956; (c) Letter from John R. Patrick, Ass't. to City Engineer, dated February 13, 1956; (d) Sketch of tract.

Councilman Jahn moved to concur with the recommendation of the Planning Commission.

Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

4. A letter from George C. Powell, Planning Director, dated May 25, 1956, submitting recommendation of the Planning Commission that proceedings be initiated to annex that certain inhabited territory known as the "El Nido Annexation."

Councilman Benstead moved to concur with the recommendation of the Planning Commission.

Motion, seconded by Councilman Drale, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

5. Letter dated May 25, 1956, from George C. Powell, Planning Director, submitting recommendation of the Planning Commission for approval of a letter and adoption of a Resolution from the Southern California Planning Congress regarding Federal participation in Smog Control Program.

There were no objections, and this was referred to the offices of the City Attorney and the City Manager for recommendation, and if this merits their approval, preparation of a Resolution.

6. CASE NO. 380: Transmittal form from Planning Commission recommending approval of request of Joe Heller et al for Change of Zone from A-1 to C-2 on the northwest corner of Arlington and 174th Street situated at 17341 South Arlington Avenue, to enable petitioner to construct a shopping area.

The Mayor set the date for the third and final Hearing before the City Council on Case No. 380 as June 26, 1956, at 8:00 P. M.

7. CASE NO. 387: Transmittal form from Planning Commission recommending denial of request of Sahdala Brothers for Variance and Conditional Permit to establish a real estate office at 18721 South Crenshaw Boulevard, in Land Use Zone R-1.

Councilman Benstead moved to concur with the Planning Commission in denial of this request.

Motion seconded by Councilman Jahn.

Planning Director Powell asked if the Council had read the letter from Saldala Brothers which was attached, and said that in view of this letter the Planning Commission would like to have this case back.

Councilman Benstead withdrew his motion, and Councilman Jahn his second.

There were no objections, and Case No. 387 was referred back to the Planning Commission.

8. A letter from George C. Powell, Planning Director, dated May 29, 1956, concerning the request of B & A Investment Company, subdividers of Tract No. 19581, to erect a redwood fence instead of a masonry fence, along the north line of said tract, was the next item on the Agenda. This had been referred to this meeting of the Council from their meeting of May 22, 1956, so that Mr. Powell would be able to be present.

Mr. Powell explained the request to the Council.

Councilman Benstead moved the subdivider be required to put in a masonry fence and not a redwood fence.

Motion, seconded by Councilman Drale, carried by the following roll call vote: AYES: COUNCILMEN: Benstead, Blount, Drale, Jahn. NOES: COUNCILMEN: Isen. ABSENT: COUNCILMEN: None.

City Clerk Bartlett read:

Motion, seconded by Councilman Jahn, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

ORDINANCE NO. 804

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE ADOPTING THE "UNIFORM PLUMBING CODE, 1955 EDITION" AS AMENDED AND REPEALING CHAPTER 21 OF "THE CODE OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE, 1954".

Councilman Benstead moved to dispense with further reading of the Ordinance.

Motion, seconded by Councilman Jahn, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Councilman Benstead moved for adoption of Ordinance No. 804 at its second and final reading.

Motion, seconded by Councilman Jahn, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

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ORDINANCE NO. 807

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE APPROVING THE ANNEXATION TO THE CITY OF TORRANCE OF THAT CERTAIN TERRITORY IN THE COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES DESIGNATED AS "DOMINGUEZ-HAWTHORNE (VICTOR PARCEL)".

Councilman Drale moved to dispense with further reading of the Ordinance.

Motion, seconded by Councilman Benstead, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Councilman Drale moved for adoption of Ordinance No. 807 at its second and final reading.

Motion, seconded by Councilman Benstead, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

ORDINANCE NO. 808

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE AMENDING APPENDIX I OF "THE CODE OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE, 1954" (ADOPTED BY ORDINANCE NO. 791), RECLASSIFYING THAT CERTAIN PROPERTY DESCRIBED IN PLANNING COMMISSION CASE NO. 379.

Councilman Drale asked if the Council was not going to adopt Mr. Jahn's suggestion of having a sketch of locations involved in such matters, and City Engineer Bishop said sketches would be available henceforth.

Councilman Drale moved to dispense with further reading of the Ordinance.

Motion, seconded by Councilman Blount, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Councilman Drale moved for adoption of Ordinance No. 808 at its second and final reading.

Motion, seconded by Mayor Isen, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

ORDINANCE NO. 809

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 16 OF THE TORRANCE CITY CODE RELATING TO THE LICENSING AND REGULATING OF BUSINESSES AND TRADES TO PROVIDE THAT LICENSE FEES SHALL BE PRO-RATED ON A QUARTERLY BASIS AND AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 743.

Councilman Benstead moved to dispense with further reading of the Ordinance.

Motion, seconded by Councilman Jahn, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Councilman Benstead moved for adoption of Ordinance No. 809 at its second and final reading.

Motion, seconded by Councilman Jahn, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

ORAL COMMUNICATIONS

City Manager Stevens had a letter from Steve P. Rados, Inc., about the progress of the Cabrillo Avenue Flood Control Project, which contained the projected completion dates of the work being done by Rados. Mr. Stevens offered to read the letter.

Mayor Isen suggested that copies of this letter be furnished to the various Councilmen instead, and it was so agreed.

Councilman Blount read the letter.

Councilman Drale said he had received several complaints about the fact that the western side of Western Avenue, from 190th Street to Torrance Boulevard, is unlighted. He asked for a survey to see if lights could be provided without too much expense.

There were no objections, and it was so ordered.

Mayor Isen asked the City Attorney when the Resolution necessary for the condemnation of land for a park at the Civic Center site would be ready, and City Attorney Hall said this would be prepared as soon as the description of the land is furnished to his office by the City Engineer.

City Engineer Bishop said his office had sent this in to the City Attorney's office.

City Attorney Hall said the Resolution would be presented to the Council without any unnecessary delay.

Mayor Isen suggested that the proposed park be known as "Civic Center Park".

Mayor Isen suggested that the Chamber of Commerce appoint a committee to meet with the Council at 7:00 P. M. Tuesday, June 12, 1956, at a Pre-Council meeting to discuss mutual problems. He asked the Chamber to furnish to the Councilmen a few days before that time a breakdown of the money they have raised and used over and above the City's contribution to them, and any other information they believe to be pertinent.

There being no objections, Mayor Isen directed City Manager Stevens to transmit this request to the Chamber of Commerce.

Councilman Drale asked about plans for extending Carson Street from Madrona to Hawthorne, saying he had received several queries about this.

City Manager Stevens said Carson is a major street, and that it could probably be improved from State and County funds. He went on to say that in subdivisions, the developer is required to do the work of improving streets, but that both Sepulveda and Carson, being main thoroughfares, should be covered by allocating either State or County funds for the paving. He said he believed the construction of curbs, gutters and sidewalks would be up to the developers of the land.

Councilman Drale so moved.

Motion, seconded by Councilman Benstead, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Councilman Drale suggested to City Manager Stevens that he contact the people in the area and inform them of this plan, and the City Manager agreed to do so.

Mr. Burns, who did not give his address, asked when the drainage project on Torrance Boulevard and Cabrillo would be completed, and was referred to the letter from Steve P. Rados which is in the City Manager's possession.

Mr. Burns then asked when Mullin Street would be paved, and said his building on that street is now under way.

Mr. Burns was referred to the City Manager.

Councilman Drale moved that all bills properly audited be paid.

Motion, seconded by Councilman Jahn, carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Councilman Blount moved to adjourn to 8:00 P.M. June 12, 1956.
