

MINUTES OF AN ADJOURNED REGULAR  
MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES  
OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE

Torrance, California,  
December 28, 1925.

An adjourned, regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance was held in the Council Chambers at Torrance, California, December 28, 1925, and was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by President Deininger. The following Trustees were present: Brooks, Smith and Deininger. Absent: Fitzhugh and Torrance.

The regular order of business was dispensed with and protests against the improvement of the Cedar-Madrid district were called for, under Resolution of Intention No. 266.

The Clerk declared that no written protests had been filed.

Mrs. Wilson voiced a verbal protest, claiming the improvement would virtually confiscate her property, but, as the protest had not been filed with the Clerk in writing, same could not be considered by the Board.

Engineer Jessup read:

RESOLUTION NO. 270  
ORDERING THE WORK IN THE CEDAR-MADRID DISTRICT

Trustee Smith moved that Resolution No. 270 be adopted as read and same filed in the office of the City Clerk. Trustee Brooks seconded the motion which was duly carried by the following roll call vote:

AYES; Trustees: Brooks, Smith and Deininger.  
NOES; Trustees: None.  
ABSENT; Trustees: Fitzhugh and Torrance.

Protests against the improving of a portion of Martina Ave. were called for.

No protests had been filed nor were any voiced.

Engineer Jessup read:

RESOLUTION NO. 271  
ORDERING THE WORK ON A PORTION OF MARTINA AVE.

Trustee Smith moved that Resolution No. 271 be adopted as read and same filed in the office of the City Clerk. Trustee Brooks seconded the motion which was duly carried by the following roll call vote:

AYES; Trustees: Brooks, Smith and Deininger.  
NOES; Trustees: None.  
ABSENT; Trustees: Fitzhugh and Torrance.

A hearing of protests against the assessment on Redondo Blvd. was called by President Deininger.

No protests had been filed, the Clerk reported.

Trustee Smith moved that the assessment, as presented, be confirmed. Trustee Brooks seconded the motion which was duly carried by the following roll call vote:

Trustee Smith introduced:

ORDINANCE NO. 126  
AN ORDINANCE CALLING A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD IN CERTAIN TERRITORY TO BE KNOWN AS NORTHWEST TORRANCE ON THE 9TH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1926, AND PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMITTING TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF SAID DISTRICT THE PROPOSITION OF ANNEXING SAID TERRITORY TO THE CITY OF TORRANCE, DESIGNATING THE POLLING PLACE AND APPOINTING ELECTION OFFICERS FOR SAID ELECTION

Trustee Brooks mentioned the danger of driving onto Redondo Boulevard from side streets, suggesting boulevard stops along the street.

Mr. Vonderahe complained of the poor drainage at the corner of Carson, Cabrillo and Cravens; also mentioned that Cravens Avenue should be widened to carry traffic to and from Redondo Boulevard, offering 10 feet of his property for same.
