MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING
OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF TORRANCE.

The regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Torrance was held in the Council Chambers at Torrance, California, June 4, 1929, and was called to order at 7:50 P. M. by Mayor Dennis.

The following Trustees were present: Maxwell, Nelson, Steiner and Dennis.

Absent: Trustee: Wolfe.

The minutes of the adjourned regular meeting of May 28th., 1929, were read and approved as read.

Clerk Bartlett read the following communications:

A letter from the Pacific Electric under date of May 31st., 1929, acknowledging our letter of May 30th., 1929.

A letter from Mrs. Jessie F. Smith, Lomita, under date of May 28th., 1929, asking to withdraw her name from petitions for annexation.

Trustee Steiner moved that signature be dis-regarded when checking the petition.

Trustee Maxwell seconded the motion, which was duly carried.

Clerk Bartlett read:

RESOLUTION NO. 426.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE, CALIFORNIA, ADOPTING AND APPROVING ASSESSMENT MAP OF IMPROVEMENT OF PORTIONS OF DOMINGUEZ STREET AND PORTIONS OF OTHER STREETS PER RESOLUTION OF INTENTION NO. 404 OF SAID CITY COUNCIL.

Trustee Steiner moved that Resolution No. 426 be adopted.

Trustee Nelson seconded the motion which was duly carried, by the following roll call vote:

AYES: TRUSTEES: Maxwell, Nelson, Steiner and Dennis.

NOES: " None.

ABSENT: " Wolfe.

Oral communications were next in order.

Postmaster Gourdier spoke on giving the dis-abled veterans a free license for the quarter, instead of a one day license. Trustee Steiner stated that the Clerk had been instructed to give quarterly licenses.

It was discussed as to whether Walteria would be continued to be called Walteria or South Torrance. Mayor Dennis stated that it was entirely up to the people of Walteria.

Trustee Nelson moved that the Fire Department notify the Pacific Electric to clean up the center of the street on Redondo Blvd. and all streets on which they have right of way.

Trustee Steiner moved that the Clerk be instructed to call for bids for a Chevrolet Truck and a Ford Truck.

Trustee Nelson seconded the motion, which was duly carried by the following roll call vote:

Trustee Steiner moved that the City Engineer be instructed to draw up a comprehensive map for the use of the City Council.

Trustee Maxwell moved that the Clerk be instructed to call for bids for a latest model Indian Motorcycle.

Clerk Bartlett reported that he had checked the North Lomita Annexation Petition and found there were (97) signers of which (12) were not registered, and (20) had not signed as registered. However there were sufficient names to make the petition valid.

Mayor Dennis called for protests on the petition and Mr. Kettler protested the inclusion of their property on the petition.

The Mayor called a 10 minute recess to confer with the City Attorney, after which further action on the petition was continued to Tuesday Nite, June 11, 1929, at 7:45 P. M.

Trustee Maxwell moved that all bills, properly audited, be paid.

Trustee Nelson seconded the motion which was duly carried by the following roll call vote:
