Hello,

My husband and I have lived on Paseo de la Playa for the past 5 years, and we want to thank you for your consideration to have restrictions on overnight parking.

Since the pandemic started in 2020, we have noticed a large influx of people living in their vehicles on our street. Living at the beach, we expect to have a larger amount of foot traffic and parking has always been an issue during a nice summer beach day, but now the parking issue seems to have increased since the pandemic. It has become increasingly more difficult at all times of the day, no matter what season, to find parking on our street because of the population living in their vehicles.

We have also noticed an increased amount of trash and litter being left on the street.

We have lived in other beach communities such as Hermosa Beach and Manhattan beach where we had permit parking for residents which seemed to alleviate a lot of our parking and safety concerns. We hope that this is considered by the city as part of the solution.

Thank you again for the consideration of an overnight parking restriction and we hope to hear more about the next steps.
