**7A. ACCEPT AND FILE MONTHLY UPDATE OF AERONAUTICAL OPERATIONAL INFORMATION UNDER THE PURVIEW OF THE GENERAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT**

Airport Manager Herrera presented the monthly update of Aeronautical Operational Information under the purview of the General Services Department. Members of the public spoke. Commission discussed; Airport Manager Herrera and Facilities Operations Manager

Pinela answered questions of the commission and public.

**MOTION:** Commissioner Marshall moved to receive and file the monthly update of Aeronautical Operational Information under the purview of the General Services Department. Commissioner Olmos seconded the motion; a roll call vote reflected 7-0 approval.

## **8. COMMISSIONS AND STAFF ORAL COMMUNICATIONS**

Commissioner Krc requested staff explore availability and potential cost/capacity for G100UL unleaded gas, referencing three locations identified previously; staff clarified those were airports providing fuel rather than producers, and explained the city does not operate a fuel tank—fuel supply discussions would be through FBOs (Fixed Based Operation), and staff would share information once concrete.

Commissioner Wakayama questioned the City Council vote (December 2 meeting) to move the Armed Forces Day parade to the airport and asked for concurrence to bring a recommendation to the Airport Commission agenda (January 2026) reflecting community feedback. Staff provided background that Council would vote December 16 at 6:30 on whether to reconsider the earlier motion; discussion of parade location would occur at a later meeting if reconsidered.

Commissioner Marshall requested the Armed Forces Parade item be placed on the January 8, 2026 Airport Commission agenda in order for the commission to make a recommendation to City Council at the January 13, 2026 meeting; General Services Director Megerdichian stated staff would do their best to place the item on the January 8<sup>th</sup> meeting, stating requests can be made of staff, however, the commission can't direct staff when to bring the items forward.

General Services Director Megerdichian answered questions of commission raised during commissions orals.

Commission consensus by a show of hands (6-1) to bring the Armed Forces Parade item to a future Airport Commission meeting for discussion.

**MOTION:** At 7:43 PM. Commissioner Wakayama moved to adjourn the meeting to January 8, 2025 at 7:00 PM in the West Annex Commission Meeting Room. Commissioner Krc seconded the motion; a roll call vote reflected 7-0 approval.


**SUBJECT: Accept and File General Services – Discussion of the 2026

At its meeting of December 11, 2024, the Commissioner Wakayama obtained concurrence from the Airport Commission via a 6-1 vote for staff to return with an item to discuss the 2026 Armed Forces Day Parade at the Airport. The Commission concurred to provide an opportunity for the community and Airport Commission to discuss the location of the Armed Forces Day Parade.

At its meeting of December 16, 2025 the City Council approved item 10D. "City Manager – Reconsideration of a Council Action Regarding the Armed Forces Day Parade and Celebration". That item was unanimously approved (7-0) by the Council. Subsequently, a special meeting was scheduled for Friday December 19, 2025 at 4:00 PM.

At that meeting, item 4A. "Armed Forces Day Standing Committee, City Manager, and Police – Reconsider and Provide Direction on the 2026 Armed Forces Day Parade and Celebration Event Location" was heard. With feedback from the community and reconsideration by the City Council, it was voted unanimously (7-0) to return the 2026 Armed Forces Day Parade back to the traditional location of Torrance Blvd.

HANGAR AND TIEDOWN INFORMATION

Total Number of City-Owned Hangars	341
Total Number of Hangar Vacancies	8
Total Number of Airport Tiedowns	181
Total Number of Tiedowns Available	41

The 341 hangars owned by the City are broken down into three size categories: small, medium, and executive. Of 341 total hangars, 74 were built by the City, while 267 hangars were funded by several private contractors. At time of construction, these hangars were built with individual preferences in mind and were not standardized according to size. Here are approximate sizes of small, medium and executive hangars.

Small Type A: Under 40' Door Opening Width	800-1,200 sq. ft.
Small Type B: 40'-41' Door Opening Width	800-1,200 sq. ft.
Medium: 52'-54' Door Opening Width	1,200-2,200 sq. ft.
Executive: 57'-61' Door Opening Width	2,200-3,200 sq. ft.

Current rates for hangars are: \$0.733/sq. ft. per month for Torrance Residents.  
\$0.822/sq. ft. per month for Non-Residents.

Current rates for Tiedowns are: Single Engine \$145.00  
Twin Engine \$160.00

Current rates for Transient (Overnight) are: Single Engine \$11.00  
Twin Engine \$18.00  
Jet Engine \$25.00

### **TORRANCE AIRPORT – ZAMPERINI FIELD PROJECT STATUS UPDATES**

<b>TOPIC</b>	STATUS 01/02/26
Automated Weather Observing System (AWOS)	<p>Royal Electric has completed 90% of construction and installation of the Automated Weather Observing System (AWOS). This project began on Monday, August 11, 2025 and will continue through Thursday, October 9, 2025. Cost for the construction \$646,000.</p> <p>Notice to Air Missions (NOTAMS) were issued for Runway and Taxiway closures due to construction activity.</p> <p>The FAA will have the final approval of the go-live date once construction, frequencies and connection to the FAA equipment is determined by the FAA/inspector and certification of the AWOS is completed. Currently the project is on hold until the FAA returns to regular operation due to the holidays.</p>
Airport Runway / Taxiway Lighting and Signage	<p>The selected proposal for Airport Runway / Taxiway Lighting and Signage design and construction was presented at the December 16, 2025 City Council Meeting, and awarded to Royal Electric of Long Beach, CA. Total amount of \$5,333,332. The Airport remains open for overnight operations, please check NOTAMS for closures.</p>
FAA Tower HVAC - Replacement	<p>At their June 3, 2025 meeting, the City Council approved and awarded contract to ACCO Engineered Systems in the amount of \$807,344 for HVAC replacement in the FAA Tower. This will replace the existing heating and air-conditioning equipment for this building. Pre-construction meeting took place July 1, 2025 to begin the design. Plans have been approved and Pre-Construction meeting has taken place December 17, 2026 for installation of the HVAC in the</p>

FAA Tower.

#### **Airport Incidents:**

November 2025

11/4/25 – 18:35 Mobile 102 responded to a Piper PA-28 with power failure 15 minutes after take-off from Palomar Airport. Aircraft landed safely on 29L. Aircraft stopped at taxiway delta and the ramp. Aircraft towed to tiedown 221 without further incident. TFD was not required.

11/29/25 – 13:05 Mobile 102 responded to a Rutan Defiant with fuel pressure loss when returning from Catalina Island. Aircraft landed safely on 29R. Mobile 102 and TFD Engine 92 followed aircraft to the ramp. Aircraft taxied from ramp to East T hangar without further incident.

11/30/25 11:30 Mobile 102 responded to a Piper PA-28 aircraft with engine roughness while flying near Torrance Airport. Pilot declared emergency and TFD was dispatched. Aircraft landed safely without incident. TFD responded. Aircraft taxied to transient parking without assistance.

#### Definitions:

**ACCIDENTS:** An occurrence associated with the operation of an aircraft, which takes place between the time any person boards the aircraft with the intention of flight and all such persons have disembarked, and in which any person suffers death or serious injury, or in which the aircraft receives substantial damage.

**SUBSTANTIAL DAMAGE** means damage or failure which adversely affects the structural, strength, performance, or flight characteristics of the aircraft, and which would normally require major repair or replacement of the affected component. Engine failure or damage limited to an engine if only one engine fails or is damaged, bent fairings or cowling, dented skin, small punctured holes in the skin or fabric, ground damage to rotor or propeller blades, and damage to landing gear, wheels, tires, flaps, engine accessories, brakes, or wingtips are not considered "substantial damage".

**SERIOUS INJURY** means any injury which: (1) requires hospitalization for more than 48 hours, commencing within 7 days from the date the injury was received; (2) results in a fracture of any bone (except simple fractures of fingers, toes, or nose); (3) causes severe hemorrhages, nerve, muscle or tendon damage; (4) involves any internal organ; or (5) involves second or third degree burns; or any burns affecting more than 5% of the body surface.

**INCIDENT:** Any occurrence other than an accident associated with the operation of an aircraft, which affects or could affect the safety of operations.

**NOTE: Per the FAA, Airport Operations totals will no longer be reported for the previous month. Due to automation, the totals will now be reported two months after they occur.**

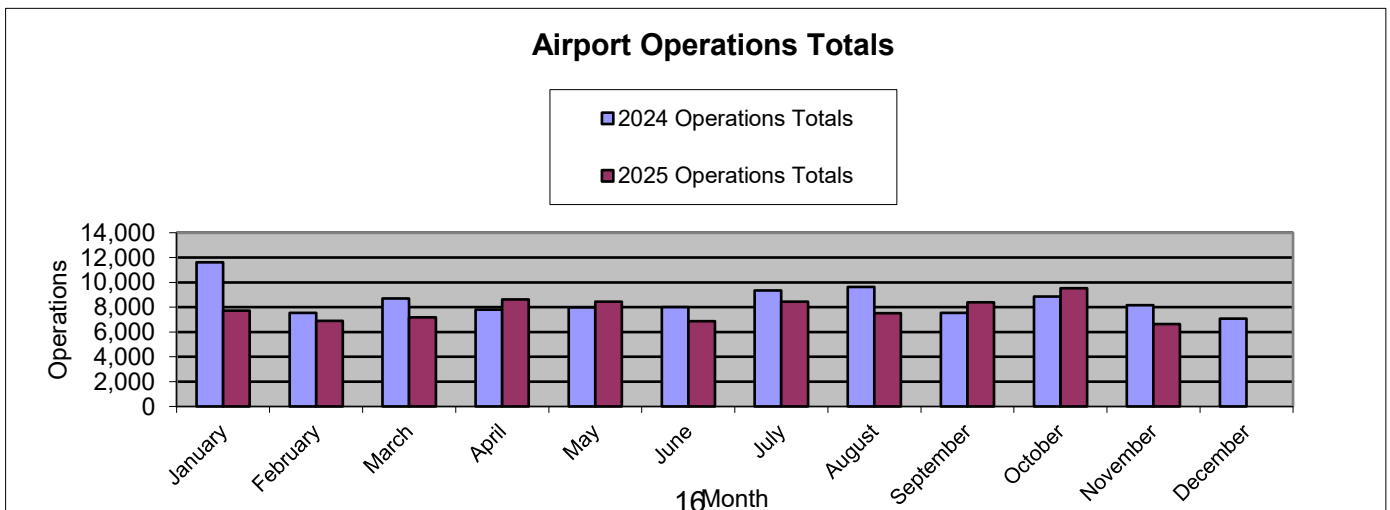

- Foreign object debris checked on all runways and taxiways
- Storm water check done (for foreign object debris) for all drains, inlets, and outlets
- All runways, taxiways, and ramp areas vacuum swept
- Various hangars cleaned and prepared for rental
- All taxiway lights and signs sprayed for weeds
- All runways and taxiways swept
- Large items removed from trash bin area
- FOD removed from fence line
